BUILDING AND GROUNDS:

- 1. Grass cutting has been slowed down considerably due to heavier rains and the return to student status by our summer manpower force. The tractor will continue to cut the large areas on a five to six day cycle; trim work in the housing areas will be accomplished when manpower availability allows. Lawnmowers and other lawn care tools may be checked out from the Buildings and Grounds Office by any Seminary occupant who may prefer to keep his own housing area cut on a more regular basis.
- All persons who have stored items in the gym or in Lea Lab 2. are asked to contact the Buildings and Grounds Office (556-3101, ext. 260/261) in order to identify their property. Ownership that cannot be determined will result in items being considered as Seminary property and handled or disposed of as necessary in order to rework available storage space in these areas.
- REMINDER Seminary regulations specify that no vehicles are to be parked or driven on Seminary grounds. This restriction 3. includes all mini-bikes or motorcycles, regardless of the age of the driver, and is especially important in the housing and recreation areas of our campus.
