The precise amount of the funds available has not been determined by Wachovia Trust, but the word is that aid will be substantial.

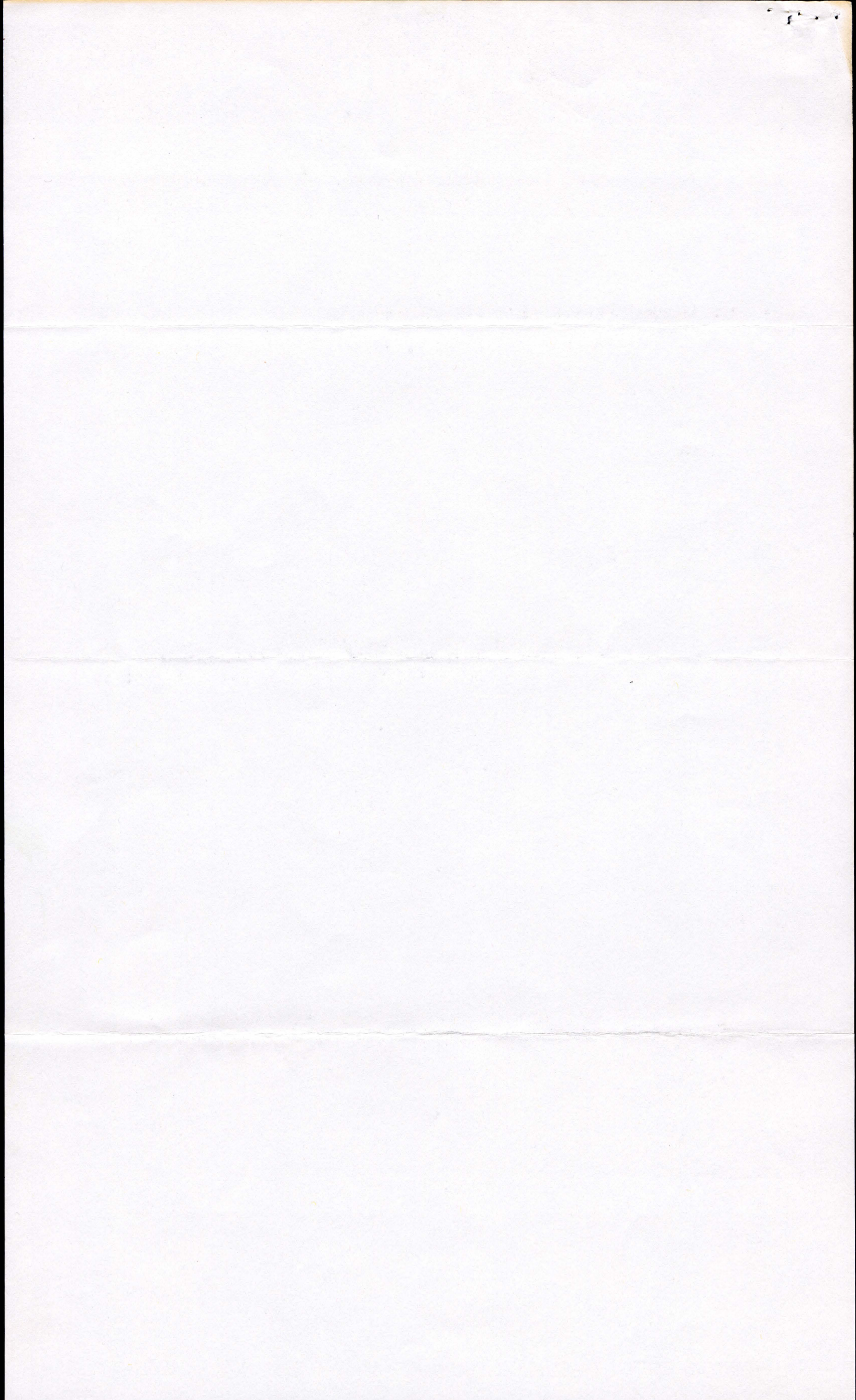

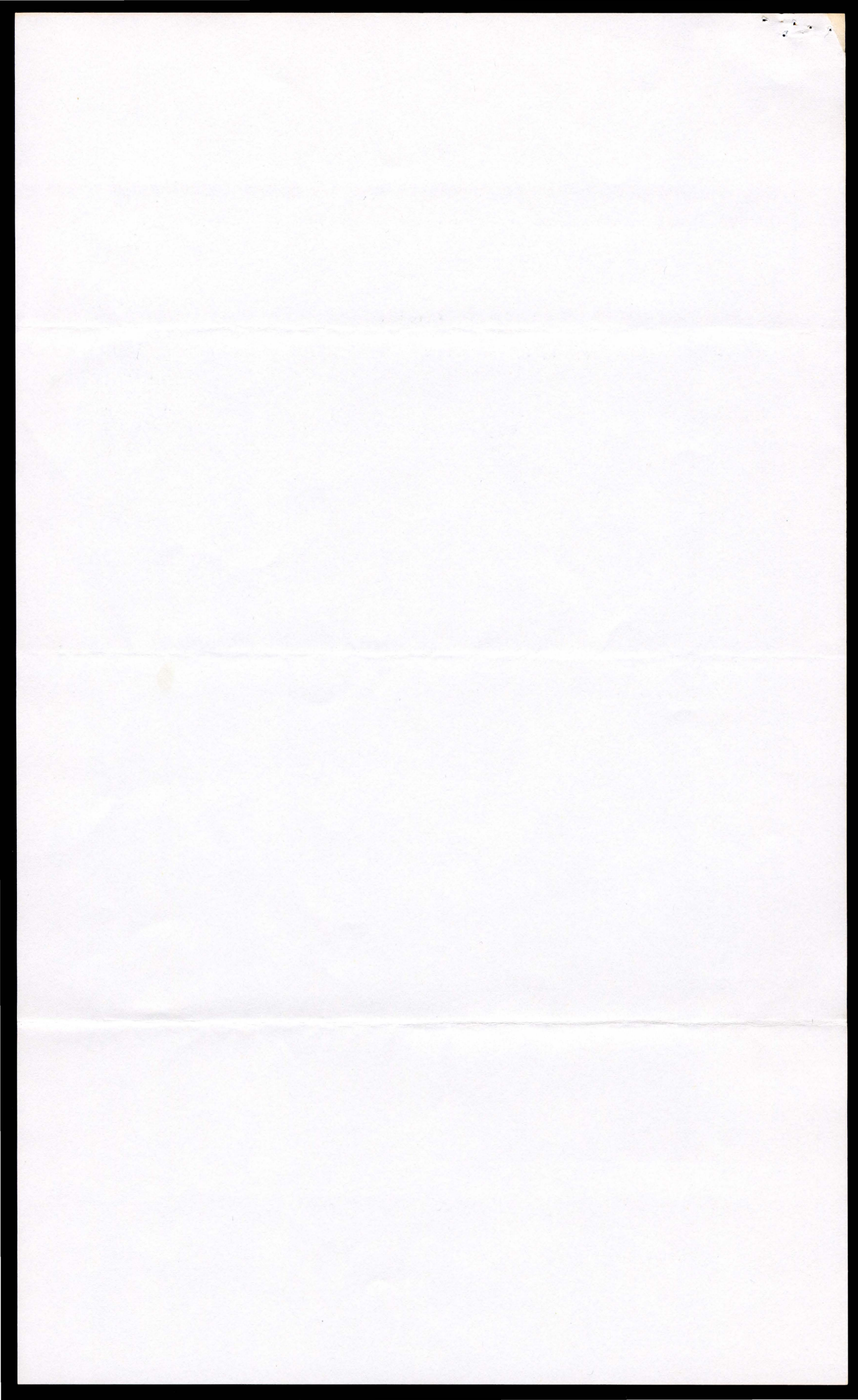
