Of the 87th Annual Session of the Oconee Primitive Baptist Association, Held With Beaverdam Church, Oglethorpe County, Georgia, October 10, 11, 12, 1924.

CIRCULAR LETTER.

The Oconee Primitive Baptist Association, to the Churches of our Faith and Order in Fellowship and Correspondence with us, sends Christian Greetings in the Lord:

According to your arrangements at the last session, it has fallen to my lot to address you in the way of a circular letter, and we desire to call your attention to the third verse of the Epistle of Jude: "Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the Faith which was once delivered unto the saints."

We will take notice to whom Jude was addressing, and it was to them that is sanctified by God the Father and preserved in Jesus Christ and called.
