Litany Of Mission

Leader: You who are gathered here today as graduates are not here

by a simple accident of circumstance.

Graduates: Whether by sudden insight or gradual understanding, we

have heard the same word that came to Isaiah saying, "Whom shall I send and who will go for Us?" (Isaiah 6:8).

And we each have answered, "Here am I, send me."

Congregation: You have come to this place in order that you might be

"equipped for every good work" (II Timothy 3:17).

Leader: But it is not enough simply to become equipped, for the

work lies before you. This, too, is the word of the Lord: "In Christ, God was reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their sins against them, and entrusting to us the

message of reconciliation."

Faculty: "...So we are ambassadors for Christ, God making His

appeal through us. We beseech you on behalf of Christ,

be reconciled to God" (II Corinthians 5:19-20).

Graduates: But we go forth to a world skilled at building walls. In

such a world, how do we declare this message of reconcili-

ation?

Faculty: "Have this mind among yourselves which was yours in

Christ Jesus, who, though He was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant..." (Philip-

pians 2:5-7).

Graduates: As ministers of the gospel of Jesus Christ, we are called to

serve in His name and by His example.

Leader: The same journey of faith that led you here, now leads you

to other places around the world. You go to exercise the gifts that God has given to you and to employ the knowledge gained through study. But even this will not be

enough.

Congregation: Jesus said, "This is my commandment, that you love one

another as I have loved you" (John 15:12).

Graduates: "Let us not love in word or in speech but in deed and in

truth" (I John 3:18).

Faculty: "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all

things, endures all things" (I Corinthians 13:7).

All: "Faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest

of these is love" (I Corinthians 13:13).
