SEBTS Trustee Report

. Southeastern trustees meeting on the campus October 10-11, 1994 established the Southeastern Baptist Theological College (SEBTC), approved a new Master of Divinity with Church Planting degree, took initial steps toward a Doctor of Philosophy degree, and adopted a land-use master plan for 300 seminary-owned acres.

Dr. Gerald Cowen, elected as dean of the newly established college, said, "Qualified undergraduate students may begin their studies in our new college as early as next January and earn a major in biblical studies; and we have also kept our Associate of Divinity degree program intact by putting it under the auspices of the college."

The Master of Divinity with Church Planting degree approved by the trustees will be a cooperative effort between the Foreign Mission Board and Southeastern. It allows students to complete the last two years of their studies on the mission field.

Trustees approved plans to begin the admissions process for the Ph.D. program. Final approval for the degree program curriculum is slated for the trustees' Spring 1995 meeting.

Trustees responded to the presentation of The Land Use Task Force, a study group established by trustee vote last March to study development and marketability of 300 seminary-owned acres, by approving the concept of the plan. Administration officials said the plan will serve to guide the school's long term planning so as to best fulfill God's purpose for Southeastern.

In his presidential report to the trustees, Dr. Paige Patterson said, "It is critically important to clarify that Southeastern is a seminary in which all points of view are taught and read. We don't want anyone to be illprepared in facing any worldview. Yet, clearly, both an evangelical orthodoxy and a Baptist faith are advocated here." In other actions, trustees:

—elected three professors to the seminary faculty: Logan Carson, as professor of theology for the seminary and the college; David Puckett, as associate professor of church history; and David Sinclair, most recently Director of Conference Programs for The Navigators, Colorado Springs, Colo., as assistant professor of preaching and speech.

-noted Shawn Madden, SEBTS librarian, has been given a presidential appointment to teach introductory Old Testament in SEBTC.

New trustee chairman Daniel Johnston closed the meeting, saying, "This is a historic day; we have approved a Ph.D. program, added a new church planting degree, and established a college. God is moving and working in this place. He indeed is blessing this school."
