History

On January 5, 1955, a meeting was held at the home of Mrs. J. T. Moss, for the purpose of making preparations to organize a Woman's Club in Youngsville. The following ladies, representing different sections of the town were present: Mrs. J. T. Allen, Mrs. Archie Brown, Mrs. G. W. Barnes, Mrs. R. E. Cheatham, Mrs. E. M. Mitchell, Mrs W. F. Mitchell, Mrs. J. T. Moss, Mrs. Wallace Mullen, Mrs. B. H. Patterson, Mrs. E. J. Pearce and Mrs. G. E. Winston.

Mrs. W. L. Wood of Warrenton, President of the 14th District of the North Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs and Mrs. Laney Hayes of the Norlina Woman's Club led in the discussion. They emphasized the importance of having a federated Woman's Club, and the many ways the community would benefit by having a civic organization for women. Sponsors for the newly formed club would be Mrs. Eva Yancey and Mrs. Patricia Leete, former residents of Franklin County and members of the Norlina Woman's Club.

As an outgrowth of this meeting, the Youngsville Woman's Club was organized on January 11, 1955, at a meeting in the home of Mrs. B. H. Patterson. There are 37 Charter Members.

Installation of officers was held at the home of Mrs. G. E. Winston on Tuesday, February 15. Mrs. W. L. Wood presided over the candlelight ceremony. She presented to the club a gavel and a framed charter listing officers and the 37 charter members.

The following officers were installed to serve through the 1955-1956 club year: President, Mrs. J. T. Moss; First Vice-President, Mrs. Harold Reddick; Second Vice-President, Mrs. Archie Brown; Third Vice-President, Mrs. J. H. Parrish; Recording Secretary, Mrs. R. E. Cheatham; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. E. J. Pearce and Treasurer, Mrs. E. M. Mitchell.

With a growing membership, the club voted to hold its meetings at the Community House. The Town Commissioners requested that we become caretakers and make necessary improvements. Thus, we had our first project.

Girl Scouts and Brownie Scout Troops have been organized with the club as sponsor. We are also sponsor for the Teenage Club, which has chaperoned weekly meetings.

Short in funds but stout in spirit, we sponsored a successful turkey supper on March 12. Proceeds of \$163.25 went for the purchase of drapery material for the Community House and for our other projects. Club members made the draperies, and friends of the club painted the Community House. In co-operation with the Lions Club, a sign has been placed outside.

The club honored the Youngsville High School basketball team, their coach, principal, county superintendent of schools and cheer leaders at a supper to commemorate the victory of winning top honors in the District 3 Tournament.

On July 13, members gave of their time and gardens for a buffet supper and \$116.17 profit was gained for the treasury.

This is how it all began and what we have been able to accomplish in a few months. Our job is far from complete — It is just beginning.

Constitution and By-Laws

Article I—Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Youngsville Woman's Club.

Article II—Object

The object of this organization shall be to bring together those who are interested in the advancement of civic affairs of any nature with the purpose of promoting good citizenship.

Article III—Members

Section 1. Any person who is interested in the objectives of this organization shall be eligible to membership. The name of an applicant for membership may be presented to the organization by a member.

Section 2. Each member shall be expected to serve in at least one department.

Section 3. The dues of this organization shall be \$3.00. \$1.00 to be sent to the State Federation; \$2.00 to remain in the club treasury payable upon joining. Thereafter the dues of this organization shall be \$2.00 a year; \$1.00 to be sent to the State Federation and \$1.00 to remain in the club treasury, payable in advance on or before the October meeting.

Section 4. Any member shall be automatically dropped from this organization if dues are unpaid at the end of five months.

Section 5. Any member coming in later than ten minutes after the hour of meeting shall be fined \$.10

Article IV—Officers

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer. The First, Second and Third Vice Presidents will automatically be elevated and the

Third Vice President and remaining officers will be elected at the May meeting. Installation of Officers will be held at the June meeting. All officers shall hold office for one year.

Section 2. The Executive Board will be made of the immediate past President, Officers, Chairmen of Standing Committees and an Advisor.

Section 3. Duties of the Officers: a. President—The President shall preside at all standing committee meetings, restrict debate within the rules of order, appoint all standing committees and Advisor, and call special meetings when necessary. She shall be entitled to vote when the vote is by ballot and in all cases when her vote would change the results. She shall be Ex-Officio Chairman of the Executive Board. She must present her yearly report at the annual business meeting in May. Before the annual convention for the N. C. Federation of Women's Clubs, the President shall answer Questionnaire which is sent annually to the club by the Chairman of the District of the State Federation. This questionnaire shall be included in the President's report to the club. At the March meeting delegates and alternates to the N. C. Federation of Women's Clubs shall be appointed. All delegates shall be instructed. The President shall also appoint a nominating committee of three active members at the January meeting and receive their report at the February meeting.

b. Vice-President—The First Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President in her absence: In the absence of both President and First Vice-President, The Second Vice-President and or Third Vice-President will preside.

c. Recording Secretary—The Recording Secretary shall keep the roll, minutes and all other records of the club. She shall notify each member of all called meetings as directed by the President, stating the purpose for which the meeting is called.

d. Corresponding Secretary—The Corresponding

Secretary conducts all correspondence of the club, and and shall report briefly at each meeting any news from "The Club Woman" of club activities. She shall send notes of congratulations, sympathy, convalescence, etc. to club members when the occasion arrises.

e. Treasurer—The Treasurer shall collect dues, account for and disburse the funds of the club under the direction of the President. She shall serve notice on all delinquents at the proper time and she shall make a statement of accounts at each regular meeting and at the annual business meeting shall render a written report.

Article V—Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings shall be held on the Third Tuesday evening of each month at 8 o'clock.

Section 2. The organization shall have ten meetings beginning in September; ending in June. The December meeting shall be a special Christmas program (or party) and the June meeting in the form of a social and installation of officers.

Section 3. The regular meeting in May shall be the annual meeting, and shall be for the purpose of electing officers and for any other business that may arise.

Section 4. A quorum shall consist of one-third active members of the organization.

Article VI—Miscellaneous

Section 1. There shall be a Club Year Book containing the Club Collect, Officers of the year, Hostesses, Constitution and By-Laws, Programs of the year, Committees, etc. to be compiled by a standing committee.

Section 2. There shall be a Scrap Book containing news items, pictures and important events of the year, to be compiled by a standing committee.

Article VII—Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order, Revised*, shall govern this organization in all cases to

which they are applicable and which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws.

Article VIII—Amendments to the By-Laws

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds vote, provided notice was given at the previous meeting.
