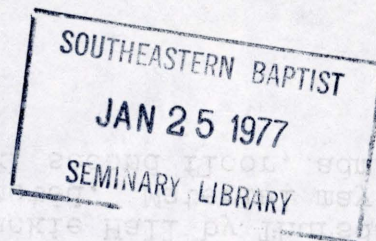

SUMMER WORK: Miss Patsy Driggers will be on campus Wednesday, February 2, to talk with students interested in working in the Preschool Buildings at Glorietta and Ridgecrest this summer. Appointments may be made through the Field Education Office. In addition, requests are already being received for summer workers in churches, youth programs, resort and park ministries and other areas. Students interested in summer work should contact the Field Education Office.

SEMINARY STUDENT MISSIONS PROGRAM: The Seminary Student Missions Program of the Foreign Mission Board of the S.B.C. provides opportunities for service in overseas missions for qualified students preparing for the preaching ministry. Participants assist missions in short-term projects and serve for at least 8 weeks. The Foreign Mission Board pays travel and room and board expenses. No other remuneration is provided and only a limited number can be sent overseas. To qualify, the student should: (1) currently be enrolled in a Southern Baptist seminary with a minimum of 12 hours completed and plans to return to campus, (2) be 29 years old or under, (3) be an active member of a Southern Baptist Church and (4) fulfill physical, mental, moral and spiritual qualifications of the FMB. Deadline for applying is February 15 to have application considered in March. See. Dr. Charles Allen, Stealey 302, extension 277, for more details.
