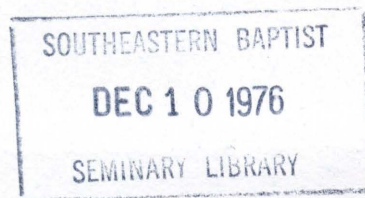
FACULTY DINNER
