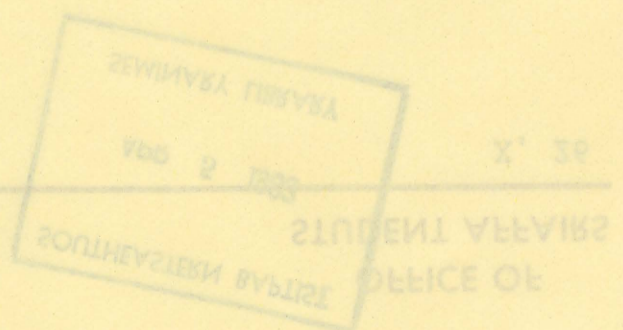
GOSPEL CONCERT:
