- 1. Meeting opered with singing and prayer by Elder D. R. M. Elveen of Stilson, Georgia.
 - 2. Introductory Sermon by Elder W. B Screws.
 - 3. The Association was called to order by the Moderator.
- 4. Called for letters from the Churches which were handed in, reac statistics minuted
- 5. On Motion organized permanently by electing Elder J. Walter Hendricks, Moderator, and J. L. Brown, Clerk.
 - 6. Invited visiting Brethren to seats with us.
 - 7. Called for petitionary letters, none presented.
- 8. Appointed committees as follows: ON PREACHING;—D. R. Mc-Elveen, C. H. Warnoch, H. S. Parrish, Geo. S. Cargill and M. L. Mixon. ON GENERAL MEETINGS:—Joe D. Brannen, Aaron McElveen and B. F. Lee. ON FINANCE:—E. J. Bird, H. V. Franklin and L. F. Martin.
- 9. Called for report of committee on preaching, who reported as follows: Friday P. M. Elder T. E. Sikes; Saturday A. M. Elder S. C. Davis, followed by Elder G. D. Todd. P. M. Elder C. E. Sanders; Sunday A. M. Elder Aaron Parrish, followed by Elder W. W. Riner. P. M. Elder J. T. McArthur, closed by the Moderator.
- 10. On motion agreed to carry in our minutes the names and autresses of all visiting ministers.
 - 11. On motion adjourned until 10:00 o'clock Saturday morning.

SATURDAY, 2ND DAY.

- 12. Met pursuant to adjournment. Singing and prayer by Elder G. Dewey Todd.
 - 13. Called the roll.
- 14. On motion appointed next session of this body to convene with the church at Metter, Ga., on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday before the Second Sunday in October 1927.
- 15. Called for report of committee to arrange general meetings, who reported as follows: Upper Black Creek, Fifth Sunday in January and Friday and Saturday before; Middle Ground, Fifth Sunday in May and Firday and Saturday before; Lanes, Fifth Sunday in July and Friday and Saturday before.
- 16. Correspondence having been suspended, we cordially invite all orthordex Primitive Baptist to visit our annual sessons.
- 17. Called for report of Committee on Finance, who reported as follows: For Minutes, \$24.00; for Visiting Minsters, sent in by the Churches, \$157.50; by public contribution, for Ministers, \$106.68; for Minutes, \$6.00.
 - 18. On motion agreed to have 500 copies of these Minutes printed, the

Clerk to superintend the printing and distribution of same.

- 19. On motion the foregoing Minutes were read and adopted.
- 20. On motion the Association adjourned.

CONSTITUTION

Whereas, the assembly of delegates at Limestone Church, Washington County, Georgia, on Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1829, for the several churches, viz: New Hope, Hebron, Mill Creek, Limestone, Hines, Fox Bay, Canoochee, Lake, Upper Black Creek, Bethlehem, Little Briar Creek, Gumlog and Bethseda, having then and there agreed to become two bodies, for convenience, called Upper and Lower Canoochee Associations.

And in the Lower Canoochee Association, Composed of the several churches, viz: Nevil's Creek, Mill Creek, Lower Lotts Creek, Lake, Fellowship, Deloach's, Upper Black Creek, Ashe's Branch, Bethlehem, Anderson's, Fox Bay, Sunlight, Cedar Creek, Beard's Creek, Bethel, Lanes, Upper Mill Creek, and Bay Branch do agree to unite on the following Principles:

- 1. This Association shall meet annually to worship and praise God.
- 2. This Association shall be composed of messengers, whose names shall be inserted in their letters.
- 3. It shall be the daty of the Association to elect a moderator and clerk to keep a record of each minute.
- 4. This Assocation will call for and admit into its body any church that is orderly and orthodox; also if any church wishes to withdraw from her body, she may do so at her discretion.
- 5. This Assocation will make its own rules to govern itself, while in session; but none of its rules shall be binding on the churches, for they are free; and so declared in God's word.
- 6. This Assocation will appoint a committee to arrange preaching during its session.
- 7. This Association will appoint a committee to arrange general meetings according to the request of the churches.
 - 8. This Association will appoint a committee on finance.
- 9. This Association will receive all visiting brethren who are orderly and orthodox Primitive Eaptists, and manifest the same by moderator extending the right hand of fellowship.
- 10. In all cases involving a change in this constitution a two-thrds vote shall be required.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

- 1. We believe in one true and living Goc, and that there are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
 - 2. We believe in the fall of man and his inability to recover hmself.
 - 3. We believe Jesus Christ to be the Son of God.
- 4. We believe particular election, effectual calling of the elect, and final preservation of the saints.
- 5. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God.
- 6. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances, and the washing of the saints' feet is an example of Jesus Christ, and true believers are the only fit subjects of these ordinances, and believe the only true mode of baptism is immersion.
- 7. We believe that no minister has the right to the administration of the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper, but such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands by a presbytery.
- 8. We believe in a final judgment, in a future reward and punishment, a 4 that of eternal duration.
