


# Leighton Paige Patterson



eighton Paige Patterson was born in Fort Worth, Texas, on October 19, 1942. He was born again and answered God's call to ministry at age nine under the preaching of his father, the late T. A. Patterson, at the First Baptist Church of Beaumont, Texas. As a 15 year-old boy, Dr. Patterson preached his first sermon at the rescue mission in Beaumont.

Dr. Patterson married his childhood sweetheart, the former Dorothy Jean Kelley of San Antonio, Texas, on June 22, 1963, while they both pursued Bachelor of Arts degrees at Hardin-Simmons University in Abilene, Texas. Dr. and Mrs. Patterson each completed requirements for Master of Theology degrees in 1968 at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, located in New Orleans, Louisiana, and in 1973 Dr. Patterson received a Doctor of Theology degree from the seminary. Mrs. Patterson earned a Doctor of Ministry degree in 1978 from Luther Rice Seminary, now located in Atlanta, Georgia. In 1991 Mrs. Patterson began doctoral work in theology at the University of South Africa.

In 1975 Dr. Patterson joined the staff of the First Baptist Church of Dallas, Texas, as president of what is now Criswell College. Beginning with a faculty of four and only twelve students, the Criswell College grew to a pinnacle of nearly four hundred students and a faculty of twenty-two. Dr. Patterson also served the church as associate pastor.

Dr. Patterson served four churches during his ministry as a Southern Baptist pastor:

The earth is Dr. Patterson's mission field: his evangelistic crusades, mission assignments, and study tours have taken him from Tanzania to Thailand, Moscow to Morocco, and Belgium to Baghdad. Dr. Patterson's commitment to our Lord's command to "Go" knows no political or social boundaries as he has preached to peasants and politicians around the world. His preaching is requested and heard throughout the United States of America as a Bible conference speaker and revival evangelist.

Dr. Patterson has drawn from the reservoir of his theological education and pastoral experience to write six books. His first work, Living in Hope of Eternal Life, An Exposition of Titus, was published while Dr. Patterson was a student in seminary. He also wrote The Great Commission, Act III; Everyman's Bible Commentary, Song of Solomon; The Troubled Triumphant Church, An Exposition of I Corinthians; A Pilgrim Priesthood, An Exposition of I Peter; and Heaven, a book co-authored with W. A. Criswell. He currently serves Broadman Press, the publishing house for the Southern Baptist Convention, as consulting editor for The New American Commentary and as writer for the Commentary on Revelation. Dr. Patterson was managing editor of the Criswell Study Bible and The Believer's Study Bible, and he wrote the introduction and notes for a reprint of Inspiration of the Bible, by B. H. Carroll. Dr. Patterson has numerous articles and essays to his credit, published in a wide-ranging variety of theological media, from devotional to academic.

Dr. Patterson has many other affiliations as a member of these organizations:

Evangelical Theological Society;

Christian Ethics Study Commission, Baptist World Alliance; Board of Governors, Council for National Policy; Advisory Board, International Ministries to Israel; and Near East Archeological Society.

He also served Southern Baptists as a trustee on the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board from 1988 to 1992, and the larger evangelical community on the Executive Council, International Council on Biblical Inerrancy.

Dr. and Mrs. Patterson have three children: Armour Paige, Youth Pastor at Valley Heights Baptist Church in Phoenix, Arizona; Carmen Leigh (Patterson) Howell and husband Mark Anthony Howell, Master of Divinity student at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary.

On July 15, 1992, Dr. Paige Patterson continued his service to God and Southern Baptists when he became the fifth president of Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest, North Carolina. He succeeds Dr. Lewis Adison Drummond.

# Academic Regalia

The hoods, gowns, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are modified versions of clothing worn by ecclesiastics and students in the 12th and 13th centuries. They wore gowns and hoods to their lectures, probably for warmth in the damp, unheated halls where classes were held.

The designs and colors of these costumes have come to symbolize the level of academic attainment and the institution attended.

#### Robes

The bachelor's robe has an elaborate yoke but is otherwise a simple garment with a closed, pleated front and long, full-pointed sleeves. The master's robe is identifiable by its sleeves, cut for the arm at the wrist and just above the elbow, which have a distinctive oblong back and are squared at the ends. The doctor's robe, full cut and with voluminous long sleeves, is distinguished by its rich velvet trim. Robe-length front panels and velvet sleeve bars are either black or symbolize, by their color, the field in which the doctorate was obtained.

#### Caps

Graduates of American colleges and universities wear a stiff mortarboard that matches the robe in color and material. European universities are somewhat less rigid in the style of their caps. Tassels are usually black but may represent the degree held by the wearer. Tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold.

#### Hoods

The color or colors symbolize the college or university granting the degree, and the velvet trim denotes the field of study. A long hood with velvet trim represents a doctor's degree. The hood trim colors most frequently seen are signified by the following:
