MINUTES.

The Sixty-first Annual Session of the Harmony Primitive Baptist Association was held with Beulah church, Terrell county, Ga., Oct. 6th, 7th and 8th, 1899.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Eld. W. H. Godwin, of Flint River Association. Text, "Go ye therefore" (Mathew 28th Chapter, 19th verse.)

After an intermission of one hour the messengers assembled at the house and the Association was called to order by our Moderator, Deacon J. R. Battle. After singing, prayer by Bro. G. Pritchard, of our Association.

Then called for letters, and heard letters from fifteen churches, and minuted their state. Then went into choice of officers by ballot, which resulted in the choice of Deacon J. R. Battle for Moderator and R. H. Jennings for Clerk.

Called for report of committee on Deceased Deacons. Read and adopted.

Appointed the next session of our meeting to be held at Antioch church in Early county, at our usual time, beginning on Friday at 10 o'clock, before second Sunday in October next.

On motion, the thanks of the Association were tendered Beulah church and that community for care shown and the interest manifested in our Association.

Read the minutes and adjourned to the above time and place.
