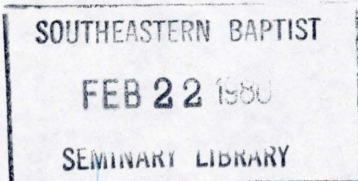

Feb. 29 - Intern Day. Approximately 20 representatives from various institutions and agencies will be on the campus on Friday, February 29 for interviews. These openings are for students who wish to do a year's internship away from the campus. These are offered through "Internships in Ministry (M-4720) for eight semester hours credit (two semesters) beginning in the summer of 1980 and continuing through May 1981.

At 10:00 a.m. on the 29th a forum will be held in the seminary cafeteria to introduce these guests and to answer questions from students. From 11:00 - 5:00 p.m. those representatives will be available for conferences in the Bethea Room. Formal appointment times are not necessary.
