Convocation marking the beginning of the fall semester (32nd year) was held in Binkley Chapel, August 31. Dr. Michael Hawn, Associate Professor of Church Music, was installed as a member of the regular elected

faculty by signing the seminary Articles of Faith. Alumnus Charles S. Coleman was recognized and presented a plaque for his role in implementing "The Coleman Challenge" setting giving records in the 1981 annual alumni fund.

Registrar, Dr. Fred Sandusky, reports a strong and stable enrollment for the fall term. Final enrollment figures will be available after the  $\operatorname{add/drop}$  deadlines. Evening classes will be held as well as off-campus classes at Shelby and Fruitland, N.C.

Data for academic 1981-82 indicate that Southeastern Seminary had a cumulative headcount during the year of over 1400 students. Full-time equivalency numbered exactly 1200 - the highest in history.

New Classroom space on the ground floor of Binkley Chapel was available for the first time this fall. The large area which had not previously
