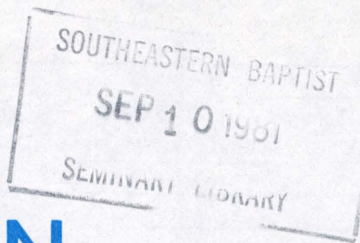

COUNSELING SERVICES:

The Seminary provides for the counseling needs of the Seminary family by offering services on

campus at the Health Center and off campus at the Life Enrichment Center in Raleigh. Dr. Chevis Horne, campus chaplain and Mrs. Marie Bean, counselor are available at the Health Center. Dr. Horne's schedule will be on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Mrs. Bean will be available on Mondays from 1:30-4:30. Appointments can be arranged by calling 556-3101, ext. 217. There is no charge for these services. Counseling services through the Life Enrichment Center in Raleigh may be arranged by calling 847-1744. Counselees will be charged \$5.00 per hour with the seminary paying the balance of the hourly charge. This joint arrangement applies up to 8 sessions after which the counselee must assume full fiscal responsibility.
