NEW COURSE ON  
RURAL LIFE TRENDS:

Professor Emeritus Garland A. Hendricks will conduct a class during the spring semester entitled "Contemporary Trends in Rural Life."

The course will deal with "What Is Happening Today." It will feature outstanding experts from this region who will speak in such areas as World Food Supplies and Needs, Prospects for Energy, New Food Products, Pest Control and Environmental Issues, Landscaping for Beauty, Animal Science, Economics, and Civil Religion in Community Life.
