MINUTES

__OF THE__

ELK RIVER ASSOCIATION.

Held With the Church at Buckeye,

Lincoln County, Tennessee.

Friday, September 11th, 12th and 13th, 1896.

The introductory sermon was delivered by Elder J. E. Frost, after which the messengers from the churches met, and were called to order by the former Moderator. Singing followed, and prayer by Elder D. Phillips. The letters from the churches were called for, and presented by their messengers; letters read, and messengers invited to seats. The letters showed the state of the churches to be as exhibited in the table.

Appointed the Clerk to superintend the printing and distributing of 750 copies of these minutes, reserving 150 copies for correspondence, and that he be allowed the remaining funds on hand after paying printing and distributing expenses for his services.
