MINUTES.

LIBERTY CHURCH, PIKE Co., Ga., Sept. 1st, 1804.

The introductry sermon was preached by Elder John Rowe from Psalm 127:1. "Except the Lord build the house they labor in vain that build it, except the Lord keep the city the watchman waketh but in vain." Followed by Elder S. G. Ratliff.

One hour's intermission.

Messengers and correspondents assembled in the house, while service was conducted at the stand by Elders L. M. Ball and G. W. Phillips.

1st. Singing and prayer by Elder J, M. Davis of Blue Ridge Association.

2nd. Read letters and enrolled messengers' names.

3rd. Re-elected by acclamation, Elder I. L. Gunter, Moderator, and Elder W. T. Godard, Clerk.

4th. Called for petionary letters and received one by the hands of her messenger, J. K. Hendrix, from Phillippi, a new constitution in Bullock Co,, Ga., which was received a component member and sister church of this body, and was manifested by the brother Moderator extending the right hand of fellowship to her messenger.

5th. Received correspondence as follows:-Blue Ridge, Elders J. M. Davis and J. R. Garrett. Little River, Elder L. M. Ball.

6th. Received petitions from sister bodies of our faith and order for correspondence as follows:—Brushy Creek Union. Letter by the hands of Elders James Gibbs and J. A. Sutton and brethren J. E. Porter, M. L. McMillan and J. W. Whiddon. Record was investigated and correspondence opened and was manifested by the brother Moderator, extending the right hand of fellowship to her messengers. Powell's Valley of Tennessee by letter which was heartily accepted aud correspondence officially opened.

7th. Appointed brother J. M. Stanly and T. J. Preston from the body to associate with the messengers of Liberty church to wit: T. M. Whatley, J. B. Bell and M. D. Spruce, a committee to arrange divine services during the Association.

8th. Appointed the brother Moderator to write corresponding letter.

9th. Appointed correspondents, to wit: Blue Ridge, Elder I. L. Gunter and brother J. K. Hendrix. Little River, Elders S. G. Ratliff and I. L. Gunter and brethren B. S. Akin, Jesse McElroy, John Barnet, and licentiate, J. Luther Hays. Brushv Creek Union Elders W. F. Rogers and S. G. Ratliff. Powell's Valley, Elders John Rowe and W. T. Godard. Blue Ridge meets Friday before 1st Sunday in October 1894. Little River meets Friday before 3rd Sunday in August 1895. Brushey Creek Union, meets Friday before 3rd Sunday in June 1895. Powell's Valley, meets Friday before 3rd Sunday in August 1895.

10th. Appointed Union meetings, as follows. 1st District: Sandy Creek, Friday before 5th Sunday in June 1895. 2nd District: Forest, on Friday before 2nd Sunday in July 1895.

11th. Appointed next session of this body, with Mt. Nebo on Saturday before first Sunday in September 1895

12th. Appointed Elder S. G. Ratliff to preach introductory and W. T. Godard alternate.

13th. Adjourned to 8:30 a.m. Monday

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 1894.

Prayer meeting at 9 a. m. conducted by J. Luther Hays. Preaching at 10 a. m. by Elder J. M. Davis, of Blue Ridge, from St. John 5:25, followed by Elder W. T. Godard from Rom. 6:23

Afternoon, preaching by Elder I. L. Gunter from II Tim. 2:19 to a large and orderly congregation and to all appearance to good and glorious effect.

Monday 8:30 a.m.

The body assembled in the house according to adjournment, while prayer meeting exercises were conducted at the stand by brother Jesse McElroy, followed by preaching, by Elder James Gibbs. Singing and prayer by brother J. W. Derick of this body.

1st. Called the roll.

2nd. Appointed Elder J. A. Wright to write next circular letter. 3rd. Called for the circular letter for this session, prepared by

brother J. W. Derick which was read, received and adopted. 4th. Called for corresponding letter prepared by the brother Moderator, which was read, received and adopted.

5th. Received contributions, for minutes \$35.55, for ministers \$56 95, by public collection \$11.34 Ordered 1200 copies of these minutes printed and distributed and that the clerk have the over plus of funds for his services.

6th. Received, read and accepted a resolution of thanks by Dr. J. M. F. Barron to this body and recommended its publication in *Towadiga Messenger*.

7th. By brother W. M. Hartley, *resolved*, that this body tender its thanks to this church and community for their preparations and kindness toward us while with them.

8th. Minutes read, received and adopted, prayer and praise by Elder John Rowe.

CIRCULAR LETTER.

The Towaliga Association of Primitive Baptists to the Churches and Brotherhood of which she is composed, together with all who are called to be saints. Grace, mercy, and peace be multiplied.

BELOVED BRETHREN :--

We have met again according to appointment and have had considerable happiness in the company and conversation of our brethren, but have great reason to be concerned at the long continued declension of religion among almost all the churches in our Union, an earnest solicitude to know the cause of this declension should exercise every Christian heart. Perhaps among many, that of the neglect of family worship and secret prayer may not be the least.

Brethren by prayer you manifest your obligation to, and dependence upon your heavenly Father for every common and special favor. By prayer you keep up communion with God and live in His immediate presence. But when you neglect prayer does it not argue the greatest indifference as though you were careless whether God blessed you or your families, and that everything He had to bestow was not asked for ?
