**TUCKASEIGEE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION**  
**Proceedings of 194th Annual Meetings**

**TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2023**

1. **Locust Field Baptist Church** hosted the first session of the 194<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association. It began at 6:00 p.m. A total of 71 present: 56 Messengers and 15 visitors representing 17 churches.
2. Chuck Norris, Moderator, welcomed everyone.
3. The choir from Locust Field Baptist Church provided special music.
4. Rev. Gary Moore, pastor of Locust Field Baptist Church, preached the opening sermon from Ephesians 4. He emphasized that we are all supposed to shining our light to the world.
5. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "I'm Too Near Home."
6. The 194<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting was called to order by Chuck Norris, Moderator.
7. The Order of Business was adopted.
8. No new pastors or visitors were recognized. Gary and Sandy Murch were recognized from Cullowhee Valley Baptist Church.

**COMMITTEES**

9. Stewardship –Vangie Jones presented the proposed 2023-2024 budget to be voted on Thursday. The budget is on page 10. She said that she had been on the committee for two years and recognized Rev. Mike Moore as the chairman who had been on this committee and participated in the Association for many many years. She also read scripture from 2 Kings 2 about taking up the mantle and doing God's will.
10. Nominating Committee – Kent Moore presented their report on page 13. It was approved.
- Annual Meeting Committee
11. Thank You - Laura Brown presented a thank you to Locust Field Baptist, Rev. Gary Moore, Faith Baptist, Rev. Larry Bryson and officers and volunteers in the association for their work in the Association this year.
12. Place and Preacher- Laura Brown presented Place and Preacher recommendations for 2024. It was approved.
13. Memorials - Laura Brown read the names of members from each church that had passed away during the past year.
14. Proposed Change to Bylaws – David Dalton presented a proposed Change to the Bylaws on page 14.
15. Miscellaneous Business – Gracella Morris reported that 17 churches were represented with 55 messengers and 16 visitors.

**REPORTS**

16. Director of Missions - Rev. Gerald Morris presented his report starting on page 3.
17. WMU – Tracy Salter presented her report on page 9. She added that churches were encouraged to participate in collecting gum for the Redbox Prison Ministry this fall, getting Disaster Relief training at Lighthouse in May and participate in the Serve NC the week of August 9<sup>th</sup>. On October 21, 2023 Lighthouse is also hosting a Deep Impact Kids program. She encouraged as many kids to take part as possible, because they would be learning how to do missions by doing it that day.
18. Music – David Dalton presented his report on page 8. He reported that two singings were held this year. He encouraged all the churches to respond to Gracella's email or call to participate. After Gracella compiles the list of churches that can participate and/or host, she sends the list to him to choose where the churches will sing.

**MISSION REPORTS**

19. Lighthouse Baptist – Rev. Mark Rogers presented a report about their Deep Impact mission trip to Fort Caswell in July. He talked about why they did it and his personal experience of getting to watch his son share the Gospel at the beach with a little card that had John 3:16 on one side and other resources on the back. They have brought back what they learned and are using it now in their local community.
20. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "I See Jesus."

### OUTSIDE AGENCY REPORTS

21. **Foster and Adopt Every Child Initiative, BCH** – Rev. Cody Whittaker, a licensed trainer for Foster Care for Baptist Children’s Homes of NC (BCH) spoke. He thanked the churches of the Association for what they had done the last year to give children hope through their donations during the Food Roundup in April. It really makes a difference. He also encouraged them to partner up with BCH to provide Foster Care homes for displaced children. There is a great need for Christian foster homes. Currently in Western NC there are only 29 BCH licensed families.
22. **The Gideon’s International** – Kenny Frizzell told about what it is and how many Bibles had been distributed. He also reported that the following had been received in their local Jackson County Camp: \$15,816 received from local churches, over \$6,000 through their Card Ministry, and \$17,945 by the Gideon’s themselves.
23. Rev. Ernie Jamison led the benediction prayer.

### THURSDAY, OCTOBER 12, 2023

1. **Faith Baptist Church** hosted the second session of the 194th Annual Meeting of the Tuckaseegee Baptist Association. It began at 6:00 p.m. A total of 56 present: 50 Messengers and 6 visitors representing 14 churches.
2. Chuck Norris, Moderator, welcomed everyone.
3. Pastor Peter Mudge of Faith Baptist welcomed everyone and introduced the special music by their church.
4. **Stewardship** – Vangie Jones read scripture from Philippians 2. She said that there was a slight increase this year and then presented the Proposed Budget on page 10. It was approved.
5. **Annual Meeting Committee** - David Dalton read the **Proposed Bylaws Change** on page 14 of the Book of Reports. After discussion it was approved.
6. David Dalton led the congregation in singing “The Glory Land Way.”

### OUTSIDE AGENCY REPORTS

7. **Fruitland Baptist Bible College** – Rev. David Horton brought greetings from the college. Currently 80 students live on campus. Online courses are also offered. Hispanic classes are also offered on campus and separate locations. Tuckaseegee Baptist Association provides one of these locations. He told about two Ministry Essential courses that are offered online (with one class meeting for 4 hours on Saturday) for Bivocational pastors. It is \$100 for each course. Fruitland shares our concern about churches without pastors. He encourages the churches to keep sending students their way.
8. **HomeBase, BCH** – Rev. Jim Dean spoke about HomeBase located on the campus of Western Carolina University (WCU). Seven years ago the Baptist Children’s Homes of NC was asked to start a program to help students from foster care and others who do not have parent or family support while going to college at WCU. They are located in the old Campus Ministries building. They have also now bought the old Cullowhee Baptist Church’s parsonage. In the last year they have provided 14,000 services. It includes food, clothing, showers, housing and Bible studies. He welcomes the opportunity to come to the churches and preach and talk about HomeBase. They would love donations such as fresh fruits, juice boxes, poptarts, small individual cereal boxes and other supplies listed on their website.
9. **Smoky Mountain Pregnancy Care Center** – Jenny Golding was not able to be there to speak, but set up a table in the fellowship hall. David Proffitt read a report for her. They have three clinics with parenting classes and limited ultrasounds being offered. Volunteers, prayers and funds are needed. They also have a mobile van. New baby bags, Mommy bags, and Daddy bags are distributed. Supplies are needed for these bags and the “Earn While You Learn Rewards Closet.”
10. Registration – Gracella reported that there were 50 Messengers and 6 Visitors with 14 churches represented for Thursday.

### MISSION REPORTS

11. Webster – Youth Pastor Caleb Mayfield presented about their mission trip to take part in NOLA. It is the New Orleans Mission Lab presented through one of the New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. This year they took 29 who participated in building projects, prayer walking, evangelistic and community outreaches. He encouraged other churches to get their students involved.
12. Ochre Hill – Becky Nicholson and Rob Sutton reported that their church has continued their partnership with NC Baptist on Mission and eight people went to work in Virginia this past summer. The

crews remodeled a bathroom, built a ramp, repaired a water damaged floor and did a Block Party involving 75 people. The Association had connected them with a \$1,500 grant from Baptist State Convention that covered the expenses for building materials. Becky said "Get Out of Your Box." Ochre Hill also continues to operate the Lord's Closet. They provide a hot meal, food boxes and devotion on the 4th Wednesday of the month.

13. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "He Rolls me Over the Tide."

14. Rev. Larry Bryson, pastor of Promise Land Baptist Church, preached the **closing sermon** about the need to persistent in your daily walk with the Lord Jesus Christ from Acts 5.

15. Rev. Peter Mudge led the benediction prayer.

## **DOM Annual Report 2022-2023, Rev. Gerald Morris**

This quarter has been like none other in my thirteen years of serving the churches of the Tuckasegee Baptist Association. Family issues have taken up an inordinate amount of time. Gracella's mother fell and was hospitalized at the first of July and passed away nearly a month later. My mother has been in and out of the hospital with age-related issues since July. I share this information as a form of prayer request and praise that God is sufficient through all things.

Please let me continue this report by going month to month with some accomplishments that we were able to lead for the churches. In July, we were naturally distracted with visits to the hospitals and my mother-in-law's funeral but I was able to, for the most part, hold regular office hours and fulfill any preaching request. Unfortunately, we were not able to participate in Ochre Hill Baptist's mission trip in the middle of July.

In August, my favorite event came around again for the year. We were able to host the 11th annual Missions Conference. We hosted 8 missionary units (the IMB's term for single or married missionaries) that spoke in 17 churches. Most churches hosted a missionary speaker either Sunday morning or evening with three hosting speakers from Sunday to Wednesday. As stated above, this year marks the 11th year that we have hosted this conference. This is unique to Western North Carolina, maybe even the whole of SBC, where small churches host several missionary speakers. Over the eleven-year run, we have hosted 52 missionary units in more than 20 churches. The churches' offerings allowed us to give a generous honorarium to each.

The months of August and September are always filled with meetings with the various committees in preparation for the Annual Meeting.

September was punctuated with two important events - the Pastors' and Wives' Fellowship meal, hosted by the Association, and the outreach at Mountain Heritage Day. The focus of the Pastors' and Wives' meal is for no other reason than food and fellowship. There is no program or speaker. The group was small but the fellowship was great.

What has become the annual outreach at Western Carolina University during their Mountain Heritage Day was an outstanding success. This year seemed to be the busiest that we have attended and we were able to reach more people than ever. I estimate that we were able to hand out the Gospel to more than 500 people with a possibility that the number exceeds 600. We passed out all of the 250 church fans, 150 purple tote bags (all with the Gospel printed on them), and an uncounted number of New Testaments by 1 o'clock. We also passed out cookbooks, children's activity sheets, Gospel tracts, etc. from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. In the afternoon, when the crowds slowed down and the college students came out, I was able to have some great conversations with several students. I know we didn't have to drive a long way to get there but this was definitely one of the greatest mission trips that I have been able to participate in.

This quarter was also taken up in a lot of what I call "miscellaneous activity". I was able to preach in and visit several churches. I was also able to participate in several online meetings and trainings. I have talked to churches about their continued struggle to recover from COVID attendance issues. I have listened to pastors and other church leaders share their struggles.

I will end by saying, once again, that it is a pleasure and honor for Gracella and me to serve God by serving the churches of the Tuckasegee Baptist Association.

### **Director of Missions July 2023 Quarterly Report**

It seems, as it always does, that the quarter has flown by and it's time to reflect on what has happened and what is being planned. This quarter has been busy in its own way.

The quarter started with a great quarterly Executive Committee meeting even though we did not have a quorum. Our quarterly meeting times have become a great time of worship through singing and devotion, information through the various reports and fellowship before and after the meeting.

April was dominated by the annual Baptist Children's Homes' Food Roundup. It is always fun to watch as each church brings in its collection of food, gift cards and monetary gifts. This year there was an abundance of food (with some churches collecting enough that they delivered theirs straight to Broyhill) and an increased amount of gift cards. Each year it is so wonderful to see the love that the churches have for the much-needed ministry of the Baptist Children's Homes.

The Associational offering and prayer emphasis was a great success as well. This year we tried a new strategy to send out envelopes in each of the newsletters that we mailed as a reminder of our need. There was a great response and nearly \$3000 was raised. We are working on a strategy to "mail out envelopes" to those that receive the newsletter through email. The offering helped to offset the loss of monies received from the Baptist State Convention of NC that we no longer receive due to restructuring at the Convention.

The persistent problem of empty pulpits has abated some this quarter. At the time of this report, there are only two churches that are looking for a pastor. The lack of pastoral candidates still persists throughout the Southern Baptist Convention and is definitely a prayer need for all of our churches.

I have been communicating with Cullowhee Valley Baptist Church during their campaign to purchase the vacated Speedwell Methodist Church building. Cullowhee Valley outgrew its original facilities and has been renting the Methodist church for some time now. The Methodist have decided to sell the Speedwell property. I tried unsuccessfully to obtain funds from the Baptist State Convention to help with this purchase. The church is currently working on raising enough money for the August closing date.

It has been great to hear the reports and see the pictures of wonderful Vacation Bible Schools hosted by our churches throughout the county. It is always exciting to see children of all ages learning about Jesus and His love -for some it is the first time hearing this. There are several more churches that are still preparing to host VBS. Several churches have used the popcorn and sno-cone machines for their VBS snack time. We also have the cotton candy machine that is available for any church to use.

The Annual Meeting and Doctrinal Committees met to discuss making a change in the by-laws to reflect the current state of our Associational churches. Some of our churches have never been and some have stopped being "in cooperating fellowship with the Southern Baptist Convention". According to the current the by-laws, this is a requirement for membership in the Association. The Annual Meeting Committee (the committee with the authority to suggest changes to the by-laws) is recommending changing the requirement from ". . . in cooperating fellowship with the Southern Baptist Convention and following the teachings of the Bible." to "in agreement with the Baptist Faith and Message 2000 and following the teachings of the Bible." This change will be brought to the Annual Meeting in October for a vote.

I, Gerald, have been able to participate in several training events through online streaming. This is one benefit that has come from changes brought on by COVID. Due to budget constraints, I would not have been able to physically attend this many meetings. I have participated in webinars hosted by the North American Mission Board, Baptist State Convention, Network of Baptist Associations, and others. I am thankful for the power of technology to bring these training opportunities to me. Gracella and I are planning on attending one in-person training event in August and would like to invite others to come with us. This is the SPARK training hosted by the Georgia Baptist Mission Board (State Convention) to be held on August 13 in Ellijay, GA. The Conference will have many sessions on a wide variety of topics. The cost is minimal. It is a Sunday but this is the best time and place to attend. Please let Gracella or me know if you are interested.

I had the pleasure of attending a few different joint worship services this past quarter. Promised Land hosted a joint service that included several churches in the Tuckasegee and Little Canada communities. The church was full and the service was wonderful. Old Savannah held their annual Tent meeting just off of 441 at the mouth of Sutton Branch and I was able to attend one of the morning services. I was also able to attend one of the monthly breakfast meetings of pastors from Macon, Swain and Jackson County. It is a great time of fellowship and worship. Each of these events thrilled my heart because it was God's Church meeting that brought churches together to worship as one.

I have been engaged in planning for future events. The first will be the 11th annual Missions Conference. We have around 17 churches in three different counties signed up to participate this year. Please pray that we will get the necessary number of missionaries to come to share what God is doing through our missionaries.

We have also been preparing for the outreach at Mountain Heritage Day coming up on September 30th. In past years, this has been a great way to reach thousands of people to the Gospel and to invite them to our churches. I would like to invite each church to send representatives to share about your church at this great outreach.

Committees for the Association are now beginning to meet in preparation for the October 10th and 12th Annual Meetings. Please make plans to attend now for this time of worship, fellowship and business.

I had hoped to set up a booth at the Back to School Bash hosted by the Jackson County Public Schools but was informed by the organizers that churches were not invited to participate.

We are in the very beginning stages of planning a Fall Pastor and Wives fellowship like we held this past Spring. More details will follow.

#### **Director of Missions April 2023 Quarterly Report**

The year 2023 is moving along very rapidly and God is working in and through the churches of the Tuckasegee Baptist Association.

The news of God moving at Asbury Seminary in Kentucky was reported all over the country but God has also been moving in many other places in recent days. Old Savannah (Tuesday evening) and Webster (multiple times weekly) both have regular times for people to gather in prayer. Recently, Webster held a 24-hour period of fasting which ended in a service of prayer during the Wednesday evening service. God is also moving in His peoples' hearts to send revival with several churches scheduling revivals. But at New Hope, God did the scheduling. Revival broke out during a "regular" Sunday morning and services continued for that week and spilled over into much of the next week. May we all continue to plead with God to send us a revival and spiritual awakening.

Times of prayer have not been confined to the members of certain churches. Several preachers from the counties of Macon, Jackson and Swain Counties are meeting monthly for breakfast and prayer. I have been able to attend two meetings and have been blessed at both. I was also so glad to see around 50 people (including the principal and Superintendent) turn out at Scotts Creek Elementary School to prayer walk the halls. It was a beautiful sight to see so many people from all walks of life quietly praying for the students, faculty, and staff of one of our schools. May God move in a mighty way in our youth.

In March, Gracella and I had the honor of hosting several pastors and their wives for a fellowship meal at the Baptist Center. The meal was catered and no program was planned. This was a time for these servants of God to connect or reconnect with those that serve in other churches. For some of the attendees, this was an introduction to pastors that they had never met.

This March was the Annual Spring Singing. This year we saw an increase in the number of participating churches as we move further from COVID. We love to hear the reports of wonderful times of worship and fellowship that comes from our Spring and Fall Singings. Check out the April Baptist Herald newsletter to see the pictures of the Singing.

We continue to provide several resources for our member churches. The popcorn, sno-cone, and cotton candy machines are always a hit. We still have some decorations and supplies for VBS. The van was used by Hyatt's Chapel for a trip to Asheville. It is ready for any member church to use. Another resource that is once again available is the Annie Hoyle mission scholarship. The Missions Committee met and has a recommendation for granting a scholarship to one of our churches that will be presented at this meeting.

With COVID came a lot of changes. One of the good changes is the use of video conferencing. With video conferencing, I have been able to attend more meetings and training sessions than in the past because of financial constraints. I attended webinars from Guidestone and Network of Baptist Associations gaining great information. I also joined DOMs throughout the state on a nearly monthly web meeting with Todd Unzinger, Executive Director/Treasurer for the Baptist State Convention. Each month, Todd shares with us his new objectives for the Convention and any news that he feels is relevant to our Associations.

Even with the advent of online meetings, sometimes it is best to meet face to face. Most months, the DOMs of Region 10 (Associations from Jackson to Truett) meet for lunch and to discuss what is going on in their respective Associations. Representatives from the Convention also meet with us and share any new information that they might have. Each time we have met I have learned new information that is valuable for our Association.

In addition to hearing from the leaders of the State Convention, I have often been in contact with them on behalf of our churches. I have been advocating for grants and other types of help for some of our churches as the need arises.

Gracella and I have been planning several missions endeavors this quarter. We continue to work on the Fall Missions Conference. We have requested more missionaries and are coordinating more host churches than ever before. God has blessed each of the previous ten years and I believe He will bless us again this year.

We are working on the following local missions: Through Mountain Heritage Day on September 30th on the campus of WCU, we are looking forward to reaching hundreds of people with the Gospel and will need the help of our churches. We are also looking into the possibility of reaching out to over 1,000 families at the second Back to School Bash in the Fall.

I was invited to share a short devotion to the Scotts Creek Elementary FCA before school in January. I spoke on the need for each Christian student to be the light of Christ in the school. I share the need for them to be good students that set a good example so they would have a good testimony to share with their fellow students and even the adults in the schools.

We were able to ship out several boxes of Bibles, Christian books, and used Sunday School literature to BookLink Int. in central Kentucky. We are grateful for the volunteers that delivered the materials free of charge. This allowed us to send more money to go to ship the literature overseas.

We also met with Lewis Smith of the Baptist Children's Home of NC to discuss the Annual Food Roundup. We will be collecting food for Broyhill until the end of April. We will need volunteers to help sort and deliver the food in early May.

As always, it is a pleasure to share our risen Savior by serving the churches of the Tuckaseegee Baptist Association. Gracella and I are excited to help you and your church in any way that we can. Please don't hesitate to call, text or email us with your needs.

## **Director of Missions January 2023 Quarterly Report**

It is amazing that we have wrapped up another year and moving rapidly into a new one. I am excited to see what 2023 holds for each of our churches as God is moving in our Association. From Cashiers to Qualla and Balsam to Cowee, God is working in various ways as each church is following the path that God has determined for them. His blessings have been multiplied as the churches have reached out to partner together to do much more than we could individually.

Associational churches have worked together to share God's love by feeding the hungry, providing clothing, supplying wood for warmth, giving access to the world by building handicap ramps, providing simple medical checkups with the NC Baptist on Missions Medical Bus, sharing worship with those confined to a long-term care facility, supporting missionaries throughout the world prayerfully and financially and many other endeavors. All of this is to glorify God and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Each church could have worked alone but most worked together with others to multiply their efforts and shine the Light more brightly in this ever-darkening world.

It is Gracella's and my pleasure to be able to serve the churches of the Association as they seek to serve the Lord through greater cooperation. I will briefly share a few things that we have been doing this last quarter.

The greatest tool that we have to help the church work better in cooperation is simply to listen. We are always listening to the heart of each church and how they plan to serve the Lord. Often we hear a common ministry idea forming in more than one church. We then connect those churches together so they can share the work. Other times we listen as a church is working alone to do a ministry and they are in need of help. Often we can connect that church with another church that has people with particular skills that will be helpful. The Baptist Herald, the Association's newsletter, is also a great way that churches with similar ministry burdens can find others to work together.

We also turn our ears outward for sources of help for our churches. I have been in regular meetings, both on Zoom and personally, with representatives from the Baptist State Convention. From these meetings, we have been able to find financial help for several Associational churches to further their ministries. We have found other ways that the Convention can help our churches through partnerships. I have also been meeting regularly with the DOMs in the Western NC counties. These meetings have been fruitful in gathering ideas and resources to help our churches. More good will continue to come from these meetings.

We are continuing to work to fully restart the Rest Home services which have been a wonderful example of cooperation for many years. Like most things, the rest home services were suspended but are now in the process of restarting. Currently, churches are worshiping with Morning Star and The Hermitage each week. Vero and Skyland have expressed the desire to restart Sunday church visits also. The problem is that we do not have enough churches to fill all of the slots. We are currently working on alternative strategies and searching for more volunteer churches or individuals. This is a wonderful and much needed ministry and we hope to see all four rest homes served.

One other partnership that has been in the work for some months that I am now able to discuss is the generous act of the congregation of New Savannah Baptist Church. Seeing that the number of members had dropped to critically low numbers, the congregation contacted me. Meeting with the trustees, I shared a few different options for moving forward. The option that the trustees took back to the congregation was to give the building and grounds of New Savannah to the congregation of El Centro del Señor. After doing some much needed repairs and upgrades, the members of El Centro del Señor were able to meet Dec. 18th for the first service in their own church building. After more than 20 years of meeting in borrowed spaces, the congregation finally has a home. They plan to have a special service in the Spring to formally thank the members of New Savannah for their generosity.

The remainder of the time spent this quarter was spent planning for 2023. We have been working on fellowship, missions, ministry, training, etc. opportunities for this new year. We will be sharing these opportunities with you in the near future.

**BY-LAWS OF THE TUCKASEIGEE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION, INC.**

**ARTICLE I. NAME**

The name of the body shall be the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association, Incorporated.

**ARTICLE II. OBJECTIVES**

The purpose of the Association is to be a fellowship of churches on mission in our setting. The specific objectives of the Association are as follows:

1. To promote harmony, understanding and spiritual power between the churches.
2. To afford and promote a larger fellowship of Christians in the work of Christ.
3. To provide such programs, projects and organizations as will strengthen the churches and assist them in achieving their goals and objectives.
4. To discover needs which cannot be met effectively by churches individually and to coordinate the use of resources in meeting these needs.
5. To encourage support by every church for the mission causes of the Association, the North Carolina Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention.

**ARTICLE III. AUTHORITY**

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the power to elect and install its officers in whatever manner the body may deem expedient.

SECTION 2. The Association shall have power to recommend measures of usefulness and guidance to our churches in matters of organization, ordinations and questions of doctrines and discipline,

SECTION 3. The Association shall have no power to infringe upon the right of local churches as autonomous bodies.

**ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP**

SECTION 1. The Association shall be composed of regularly constituted Baptist churches in agreement with the Baptist Faith and Message 2000 and following the teachings of the Bible.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive or reject churches applying for membership therein at its pleasure. Churches applying for membership shall agree to come under the watchcare of the Association for one year. It is understood that during this period of watchcare the church shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except those of voting.

Applications for membership shall be presented to the Doctrine Committee of the Association. The applications will consist of a letter from a constituted church stating their desire to affiliate with the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association. The Doctrine Committee as a part of the review process may invite the requesting church to a conference to discuss its history, its mission strategy, and any other information that may be pertinent to the application. The Doctrine Committee may then approve the application and recommend them to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee may by a simple majority vote accept the requesting church to come under the watchcare of the Association for one year. Any church under watchcare is expected to participate in and financially support the Association. At the end of the year, the church may be voted in as a member of the Association with full privileges by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting at the annual meeting of the Association, at the recommendation of the Doctrine and Executive Committees and at least one messenger be present at the meeting.

SECTION 3. Any church may withdraw from the Association at its pleasure and should notify the Association of this action in writing. Such action will be recognized by the Association at the next annual meeting.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of each church to furnish the Associational Clerk, before each annual session, a Church Profile, the forms provided by the Associational Clerk, giving the information requested as is applicable to each church situation.

SECTION 5. The Association may withdraw from any church which has become unscriptural in its doctrine or practices by a two-thirds majority vote of the messengers present and voting at the annual meeting. Such vote is to be taken by written ballot.

**ARTICLE V. MEETINGS**

SECTION 1. The Association shall hold its annual meeting on Tuesday and Thursday following the second Sunday in October. Special meetings of the Association may be called by the Executive Committee provided two weeks written notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 2. Each church shall be entitled to be represented at the annual meeting by the pastor and one additional messenger. Churches which give to the association more than .5% of their undesignated receipts shall be entitled to an additional 2 messengers for every .5% of giving up to a total of 10 messengers for churches which give 2% of their undesignated giving."

SECTION 3. Churches are requested to elect their messengers and alternatives in conference to attend the annual meeting.

SECTION 4. In case of internal dissension in a church and two parties coming to the Association, each claiming to represent the church, neither party shall be seated until the Doctrine Committee determines which party is in union with the Association. The decision is to be affirmed by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

#### ARTICLE VI. OFFICERS

SECTION 1. General officers of the Association shall be: Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Parliamentarian, Assistant Parliamentarian, Director of Missions, Trustees and team leaders. Team leaders shall be chosen by the Nominating Committee as needed to serve the purposes of the Association (eg. Sunday School leader, Youth/Children leader). Team leaders will work with the Moderator and/or the Director of Missions to form a team to carry out assigned duties.

Associational representatives will be elected as may be deemed appropriate and elected in the Association. Associational representatives shall be a conduit of information between outside agencies and the Association. They may also represent the Association as the outside agency's policies specify.

SECTION 2. With the exception of the Director of Missions and Trustees, the terms of office for all officers of the Association shall be for one year with the privilege of continuing re-election. The Moderator and Vice Moderator shall not be eligible for re-election but one year in succession. (1) The number of Trustees shall be three. (2) The term of service should be for three years, with the term of only one expiring each year. In the first election of Trustees, the term of service for one should be three years, another two years, and the other one year. (3) Upon the expiration of term of service, the Trustee may or may not be re-elected for another term of three years.

Each term of office shall begin with the close of the annual session. The Associational financial year will run from October 1 through September 30.

#### ARTICLE VII. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Moderator shall preside and maintain the order of all meetings of the Association and Executive Committee. He shall serve as ex officio member of all committees of the Association.

SECTION 2. The Vice Moderator shall assist the Moderator and preside in the absence of, or at the pleasure of the Moderator.

SECTION 3. The Clerk shall keep a complete and accurate record of all meetings; shall prepare a "Book of Reports" to be distributed to messengers at the beginning of the annual meeting; and prepare minutes of the annual meeting (Annual Minutes) to be distributed to each church.

The Clerk shall distribute to the clerk of each church in the Association a congregational church profile as soon as they are received from the State Convention. This form is to be returned to the Clerk of the Association as soon as possible or by the deadline set by the Clerk and Director of Missions. All program reports should be returned by the same date.

An Assistant Clerk shall work with the Clerk in preparing the "Book of Reports," the annual minutes and the registration of messengers at the annual meeting.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall oversee the receipts and disbursements, by order of the Executive Committee of the Association, of the money of the treasury and ensure that a complete report is presented at the Annual meeting and a current report at each Executive Committee meeting.

An Assistant Treasurer shall be elected to assist the Treasurer by request and to serve in the event the Treasurer resigns or is ill or unable to function.

SECTION 5. The Parliamentarian shall upon the request of the presiding officer of the body, advise and assist the Association with respect to all matters involving Parliamentary Procedure.

An Assistant Parliamentarian shall be elected. The Parliamentarian and Assistant should always communicate with each other to ensure that this office is filled at each Associational Annual or Executive Committee meeting.

SECTION 6. Trustees have no authority except by direction of the Association and are not personally bound by signatures but are to be the legal signees for the Association. Trustees represent the Association in legal matters. Trustees act on behalf of the Association in acquisition and disposal of Associational property.

They sign all deeds of conveyance, execute all notes, bonds or mortgages, intervene in all suits, by authority of the Association.

All persons dealing with the Trustees, as Associational officers, may rely upon any written resolution duly adopted by the Association or Executive Committee, directing and authorizing the Trustees to act in its behalf and certified by the Association Moderator and Clerk.

#### ARTICLE VIII. RULES OF ORDER

The business meetings of the Association shall be conducted according to Robert's Parliamentary Practice or in a manner not contrary thereto.

#### ARTICLE IX. QUORUM

The quorum for the Annual Associational meeting or any special called meeting of the Association shall not be less than 25 percent of the member churches.

#### ARTICLE X. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the General Officers and Team Leaders elected by the Association and the Pastor and one member from each church in the Association. No Pastor, by virtue of his being an Associational Officer or Program Leader shall be disqualified as a member of the Executive Committee, from representing the church or churches he may be serving in the Association. Twelve of these members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to act for the Association on matters arising when the Association is not in session and to make a report of all work to the next session of the Association. This body shall meet at a time and place designated by the Moderator on Monday following the second Sunday of each quarter except for the October quarter which shall be replaced by the Annual Meeting. Special meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by the Moderator with a one week notice to the churches.

SECTION 3. All vacancies occurring on committees or among elected officers shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE XI. ASSOCIATIONAL STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have such standing committees as may be deemed necessary to promote efficiently the work of the Master in our midst. The terms of office for all committee members shall be for three years except where specifically stated otherwise.

SECTION 3. THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE shall be composed of seven members. It shall be the duty of this committee to nominate the Officers, Committees members, Team Leaders (as needed) and Institutional Agency Representatives. These nominees shall be notified prior to presenting of their names at annual session.

SECTION 4. THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE shall be composed of six members including the Treasurer of the Association. This committee shall: (a) present a Budget to the Association for the following year; (b) devise plans for raising the funds for the Associational Budget; (c) audit the finances and financial records of the Association annually and anytime there is a change of Treasurer or at the direction of the Association or the Executive Committee; (d) report all audits to the Annual Association Meeting.

SECTION 5. THE BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE shall be comprised of three members. The committee shall be responsible for and in charge of the upkeep and repairs of the Associational building, grounds, and equipment.

#### SECTION 6. THE PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

A. The Committee shall be composed of 7 members of which 3 are pastors.

B. They shall recommend policies and procedures for the selection, supervision and termination of Associational staff personnel. Those policies and procedures shall be approved by the Association.

C. Prepare and maintain an organizational manual relation to the Association's staff personnel.

D. Develop and recommend to the association policies and procedures for paid and volunteer staff personnel.

E. When a staff vacancy occurs, other than the DOM, they shall serve as the search committee. When a DOM vacancy occurs, they shall nominate a search committee and present it to the Executive Committee.

F. The Personnel Committee shall handle grievances as outlined in the grievance policy.

SECTION 7 THE ANNUAL MEETING COMMITTEE shall be composed of seven members. The duties of this committee shall be to

A. recommend the church(es) to host the annual meeting and the preacher(s) and alternate preacher(s) to deliver the annual sermon for the following year,

B. present suitable resolutions at the annual Associational meeting,

- C. bring a report to the annual meeting of those listed by the member churches as deceased since the last annual meeting,
- D. keep the historical records of the Association up-to-date,
- E. plan the program for the Annual Meeting(s) and present it to the Executive Committee at its October meeting,
- F. shall be responsible for registering messengers at the Annual Meeting(s),
- G. and shall perform all duties specified in Article XIII (amendments to by-laws).

SECTION 7 THE DOCTRINE COMMITTEE shall be composed of five pastors and two laymen.

- A. It shall examine applications of churches seeking admission into the Association in keeping with Article IV and make recommendation to the Association. It shall counsel with churches that are out of harmony of fellowship with the Association.
- B. It shall also advise churches about candidates for ordination with the following guidelines: it serves on an advisory capacity only, serves at the request of the church from which the member is seeking ordination, is to examine such candidates as to their call and fitness for the gospel ministry and make such recommendations to the church as they feel led. It should regularly inform the Executive Committee of its work.

#### ARTICLE XII. JOB DESCRIPTION, DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. Title and Functions.

- A. Position Title. This position shall be known as the Director of Missions for the Tuckasegee Baptist Association.
- B. Basic Functions. The Director of Missions shall serve as a minister to the church leaders of the Tuckasegee Baptist Association, as mission strategist, as chief administrative officer, and as a general leader of the Association.
- C. The Personnel Committee shall be responsible to maintain, update and revise a job description as required, making recommendations to the Association for approval as they are needed.

#### ARTICLE XIII. AMENDMENTS

The constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by a two-thirds majority of the messengers present and voting, provided the amendment has been presented to the Annual Meeting Committee at least 10 days prior to the annual meeting and presented to the Association in printed form on the first day of the annual meeting to be voted on the second day.

#### ARTICLE XIV. NON-PROFIT STATUS

The Tuckasegee Baptist Association, Inc. is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

No part of the Tuckasegee Baptist Association, Inc. shall inure to the benefit of its' members, directors, officers, or other persons except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the exempt purposes of the organization.

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the Tuckasegee Baptist Association, Inc. will be turned over to one or more organizations with similar purposes which are exempt as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
