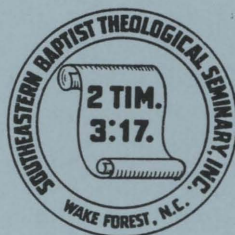

ACCREDITATION

Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary is fully accredited by the American Association of Theological Schools.

REGISTRATION

FIRST TERM—Monday, June 3, 1963. Classes will meet four days each week, Tuesday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, June 4. Two courses may be taken. Four semester hours credit may be earned in four weeks. Matriculation and schedule changing closes June 5, 4:30 p.m.

SECOND TERM—Monday, July 1, 1963. Classes will meet four days each week, Tuesday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, July 2. Two courses may be taken. Four semester hours credit may be earned in four weeks. Matriculation and schedule changing closes July 3, 4:30 p.m.

COSTS

Fees \$20.00 per term. Room \$15.00 per term. Meals, approximately \$2.20 per day, may be secured in the cafeteria. The cost of books and supplies varies, depending upon the courses taken.

FACILITIES

A completely renovated campus. A new air-conditioned library. Modern dormitory facilities recently equipped with new furniture. Rooms available for single men and single women. Married couples should write the Business Office concerning housing accommodations for the summer session.

RECREATION

Golf, Tennis, Swimming, Gymnasium. The town of Wake Forest operates a modern swimming pool. A private nine-hole golf course within walking distance of the campus will be available for a modest fee. The Seminary gymnasium will be open. Excellent tennis courts are also available.

CURRICULUM

FIRST TERM, June 3-June 28—A course in elementary Hebrew, designed for beginners in the Hebrew Scriptures, will meet three hours each day throughout the two terms and will enable the student to earn six semester hours in Hebrew.

The student who does not take the course in Hebrew may enroll in two courses and earn four semester hours each term.

In order to maintain a reasonable student-teacher ratio, the Seminary reserves the right to control the size of classes offered in the summer session.

IB 115s ELEMENTARY HEBREW

Mr. Green

A study of the elements of Hebrew grammar and syntax to prepare the student for reading the Hebrew Scriptures.

IB 243s THE EXPOSITION OF GREAT TEXTS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT Mr. Strickland

Several of the great passages will be examined lexically, syntactically, historically, and contextually.

IC 201s BAPTIST HISTORY Mr. Duncan

A study of the Baptist people, leaders, principles, practices, and organizations, including comparisons with early and medieval dissenting groups, and with modern denominations. The emphasis is upon the period to 1845.

LT 206s THE DOCTRINE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT Mr. Eddins

A survey of the biblical teaching and doctrinal development of the Spirit of God. Attention will be given to fundamental theological problems of the doctrine of the Spirit.

2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

LT 302s BAPTIST THEOLOGY Mr. Tull

A historical review of the theological emphases of Baptists, with special reference to Baptists in the South.

2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

CW 204s AMERICAN PREACHING Mr. Trotter

A study of the theological content and the methodology of American preaching.

2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

CW 241s PRINCIPLES OF TEACHING Mr. Coker

A study of the basic principles and procedures in the teaching-learning process with special attention to the work of the teacher, the psychological bases of learning, methodology, and classroom procedure.

IB 116s ELEMENTARY HEBREW Mr. Green

A continuation of IB 115s.

3 semester hours 7:30-9:30, 10:30-11:30, Tuesday through Friday
Prerequisite: IB 115s

IB 238s THE MEANING OF LOVE IN THE NEW TESTAMENT Mr. McDowell

An intensive study of the concept of love in the New Testament. The English text is used.

2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

IC 206s DENOMINATIONS AND SECTS IN AMERICA Mr. Shriver

A historical study of the major sects in American religious life, including a rapid examination of their history, leadership, and teachings.

2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

LT 316s PHILOSOPHY AND SCIENCE Mr. Newman

A review of the history of the scientific movement and its implications for philosophy and religion.

2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

IB 304s BIBLICAL ARCHAEOLOGY Mr. Lovelace
A survey of recent archaeological discoveries and their value for biblical interpretation.

2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

CW 159s MUSIC IN WORSHIP Mr. Max Smith
A survey course concerning the influence of the Jewish, Eastern, Roman and Protestant liturgies on our Baptist order of worship and hymns.

2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

CW 249s SOUTHERN BAPTIST GROWTH Mr. Wayland
A study of the factors involved in the growth of Southern Baptists with special reference to denominational program and local church methods.

2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

POST-B.D. STUDIES

In the curriculum for the second term of the 1963 Summer Session, attention has been given to requests of alumni and other post-B.D. students for advanced courses of study closely related to their vocational interests and needs.

APPLICATIONS

A student entering Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary for the first time must file an application for admission at least *fifteen days* prior to the opening of the term.
