The two consultants (Karl Munson and Particia Crotts) have completed their study of the seminary support services staff and have processory plan to cover all support services employees. The proposed plan is under review by the Executive Council with the possibility that it will be inaugurated February 1, 1980.

Southeastern Seminary, in cooperation with a number of Wake Forest church and community persons, will sponsor an Indo-Chinese refugee family. The assigned family has 13 members and are expected to arrive in

Wake Forest by March, 1980.

Claude Stewart, Assistant Professor of Theology, is recovering at home from gall bladder surgery he CLAUDE STEWART underwent on December 11.

Early in the new year the special campaign will focus on Winston-Salem and Charlotte, North Carolina. Also, plans are underway for campaigns in Eastern and Western North Carolina.

The 100 new two and three bedroom apartments will provide welcome relief for the serious housing crunch at Southeastern.

President Lolley is in process of contacting references and interviewing candidates. A recommendation will be made to the Trustees at their March meeting.
