#### REPORT ON SUNDAY SCHOOL

Your Committee believes that our Sunday school work is not appreciated because its power for good is not understood.

Religious instruction is given to the children from three sources. It comes from the home, from the day school and from the Sunday school.

Many homes give but little instruction in the Scriptures to the children; the parents are too ignorant or too worldly.

The day school does not undertake to teach the Word of God. It is not the business of the state to teach religion.

The one source which is left is the Sunday school. If we fail here sad will be our failure.

We need to take our Sunday school work more seriously. It is largely the one place where children and grown up people study the Scriptures. To be ignorant of the Word of the Lord is a calamity.

We, as an Association, need to bestir ourselves.

We want to call the attention of the Association to our Annual Sunday School Convention. Our Sunday School Associational Convention has had two helpful sessions. Your committee urges the churches to see to it that the Sunday school is represented in these annual meetings. They always help the ones who attend, and those who fail to attend miss much valuable information which they could carry back to their schools.

#### REPORT ON TEMPERANCE

Your Committee holds that we, as an Association, must be concerned in law enforcement along every line.

We believe that the law regarding prohibition is being constantly violated. We believe, further, that our churches are largely responsible for the spiritual and moral condition of the communities in which they are located. If the light that is in the churches be darkness, how great is that darkness?

We do not mean to say that our churches encourage or approve of the selling or drinking of intoxicating liquor. But we do mean to say that many of our members are careless about the matter of law enforcement against whiskey. The dignity of law and the enforcement of law ought to be constantly impressed on our people.

We recommend that our pastors preach prohibition and our churches condemn intoxication in every form until the outlawed liquor traffic and the blighting drink habit are banished from our land.

We fear that prohibition is not seriously and successfully in force in every community in our bounds. Much has been accomplished by prohibition but much remains to be done, and great and grave is the responsibility of our churches.
