Dr. Winston Crawley, Secretary to the Orient (Room 208, Wait Hall)

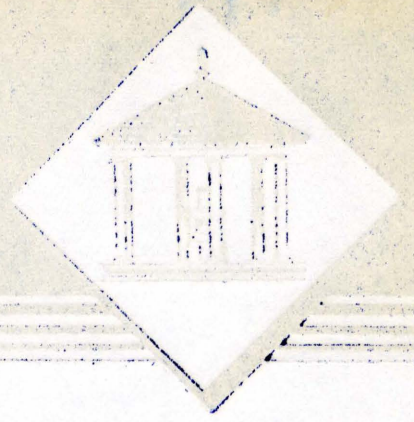
Mrs. Elmo Scoggin will be in the Johnson classroom building today from 10:30 to 3:00 for the purpose of making appointments.
