# MINUTES.

The Elk River Association met with the church at Arbor. Moore Co., Tenn., September 8, 9 and 10, 1899.

The introductory sermon was delivered by Elder H. C. Hogan, text, "Prepare to meet thy God, O Israel."-Amos iv. 12, after which the messengers from the churches met and were called to order by the Moderator. Singing followed, and prayer by Elder E. W. Walker. The letters from the churches were called for and presented by their messengers. Letters read and messengers invited to seats. The letters showed the state of the churches to be as exhibited in the table.

The Association was organized by choosing Elder J. E. Frost, Moderator, Elder H. C. Hogan, Clerk, and J. G. Frost, Ass't Clerk, The Association then proceeded to business.

- 1. Read the Rules of Decorum.
- 2. Called for petitionary letters. None presented.
- 3. Called for corresponding letters from associations with whom we correspond with the following results:

All corresponding brethren invited to seats.

4. On motion of Eld.E W. Walker the Association extended to all ministers and brethren who were not messengers, a hearty welcome and Christian greeting, and invited them to seats with us as guests.

#### COMMITTEES.

Appointed Archie Collins, W. P. Tolley, John Stephens and W. R. Fields, together with the Moderator and Clerk, a committee to arrange the order of business for Saturday.

Appointed the Clerk a committee on correspondence.

On motion the Association agreed to elect preachers to fill the stand Saturday and Sunday by private ballot. Elected Elders J. G. Woodfin, D. H. Cordell and F. M. White to preach on Saturday.

On motion the Association adjourned to meet Saturday morning at 9 a. m. Prayer by Elder B. A McClain.

#### SATURDAY.

The Association met according to adjournment; prayer by Elder J. G. Woodfin, after which the Association proceeded to business as follows:

- 1. Called the roll; a quorum present.
- 2. Committee on arrangements made the following report: "We your committee on arrangements recommend the order of business as laid down in our former minutes.

M. Johnson, Brethren W. P. Tolley and J. N. Dunaway. messengers; Round Lick, held at Bildad, DeKalb Co., Tenn, commencing Saturday before the first Sunday in September, 1900, Elder H. C. Dunaway to attend; Fourth Section, to be held with the church at Buckeye, Lincoln Co., Tenn., Saturday before the first Sunday in May, 1960, Elders B. A. McClain and W. T. Ferguson to attend.

#### COMMITTEE ON FINANCE.

Appointed W. R. Fields and J M. Spencer a committee on finance who report \$19.75 received from the churches this year to pay for printing and distributing these minutes. Report received and committee discharged.

Requested Elder E. W. Walker to preach the introductory sermon at Mt. Pisgah, Bedford Co., Tenn, at 10 a.m. Friday before the second Sunday in September, 1900, Elder B. A. McClain in case of failure.

Appointed the Clerk to superintend the printing and distribution of 750 copies of these minutes, reserving 150 copies for correspondence, and that he be allowed the remaining funds on hand, after paying printing and distributing expenses, for his services.

Elected Elders L. F. Evans, J. G. Woodfin and F. M. White to preach on Sunday.

#### RESOLUTIONS.

Resolved, That it is with profound sorrow that Elk River Association, now in session with Arbor church, Moore Co., Tenn., has learned of the recent death of our aged and beloved sister, the devoted and faithful consort and companion of our venerable Moderator, Elder John E. Frost.

Resolved, That we extend to him our sincere sympathy and condolence in his sad bereavement. While his affliction in this dispensation of an all wise God is grievous and hard to bear, he is not without the comfort and consolation that his loss is her infinite gain; for we believe and have every confidence that she has gone hence to an eternal state of glory and happiness.
