REMINDER: FIELD EDUCATION INTERNSHIPS: Four opportunities for internships in EDUCATION INTERNSHIPS: ministry are available for the 1975-76 academic year and two of these have been approved for credit in M 292 "Supervised Internship." The following internships are being offered.

Legislative Liason Intern: Department of Social Ministries of the Virginia Baptist General Board. R. Clint Hopkins, Field 1. Supervisor.

The intern will give attention to issues before the General Assembly, assisting the Department of Social Ministries with communication between members of the Assembly and constituients who are members of Virginia Baptist churches.

plete work toward his degree is also preferred. The intern will need to reside in Richmond, September through May. Stipend: \$200 per month. Fall and Spring. 8 hours per semester.

2. <u>Chaplain Intern</u>: Chaplain Service of the Churches of Virginia, Inc. William R. Shirah, Field Supervisor.

The intern will serve as chaplain to a juvenile correctional institution in or near Richmond, Virginia. 20 hours per week are required, which may be on weekends. Stipend: \$200 per month. Fall and Spring. 4 hours per semester.

3. <u>Shopping Center Ministry</u>: North Hills Shopping Center, Raleigh, N.C. Supervised by the Directors of Field Education.

The ministry is sponsored by the shopping Center, the Raleigh Baptist Association, the N.C. Baptist Convention, and the Seminary. The intern will serve as chaplain to the managers, employees, and customers of North Hills. At least a six-weeks course in Clinical Pastoral Education is required. Time required is about three half-days per week. Salary: \$200 per month.

4. Youth Ministry: The Union Church of Guatemala, Guatemala City, C.A. David F. Bridgman, Pastor.

The intern will work in the youth program of the interdenominational Protestant church and with its outreach efforts in the English-speaking community.

Open to either a recent graduate or a second-year student who will be available for one year beginning September 1, 1975. A young couple is preferred. Knowledge of Spanish is desirable, but not essential. Salary: \$400 per month. Furnished apartment and car provided, plus round trip air travel for two.

Dr. Richardson will be in the cafeteria Friday, April 4, at 10:00 a.m., to provide additional information to interested students.

SUMMER WORK: Students still seeking summer work are encouraged to inquire in the Field Education office for any last minute requests which may come this month. Two recent requests are: (1) <u>Camp Director</u>: Baptist Associational Camp wants a seminary couple to serve as directors for the summer. They will be responsible for overseeing the entire program and will supervise college student counselors.
