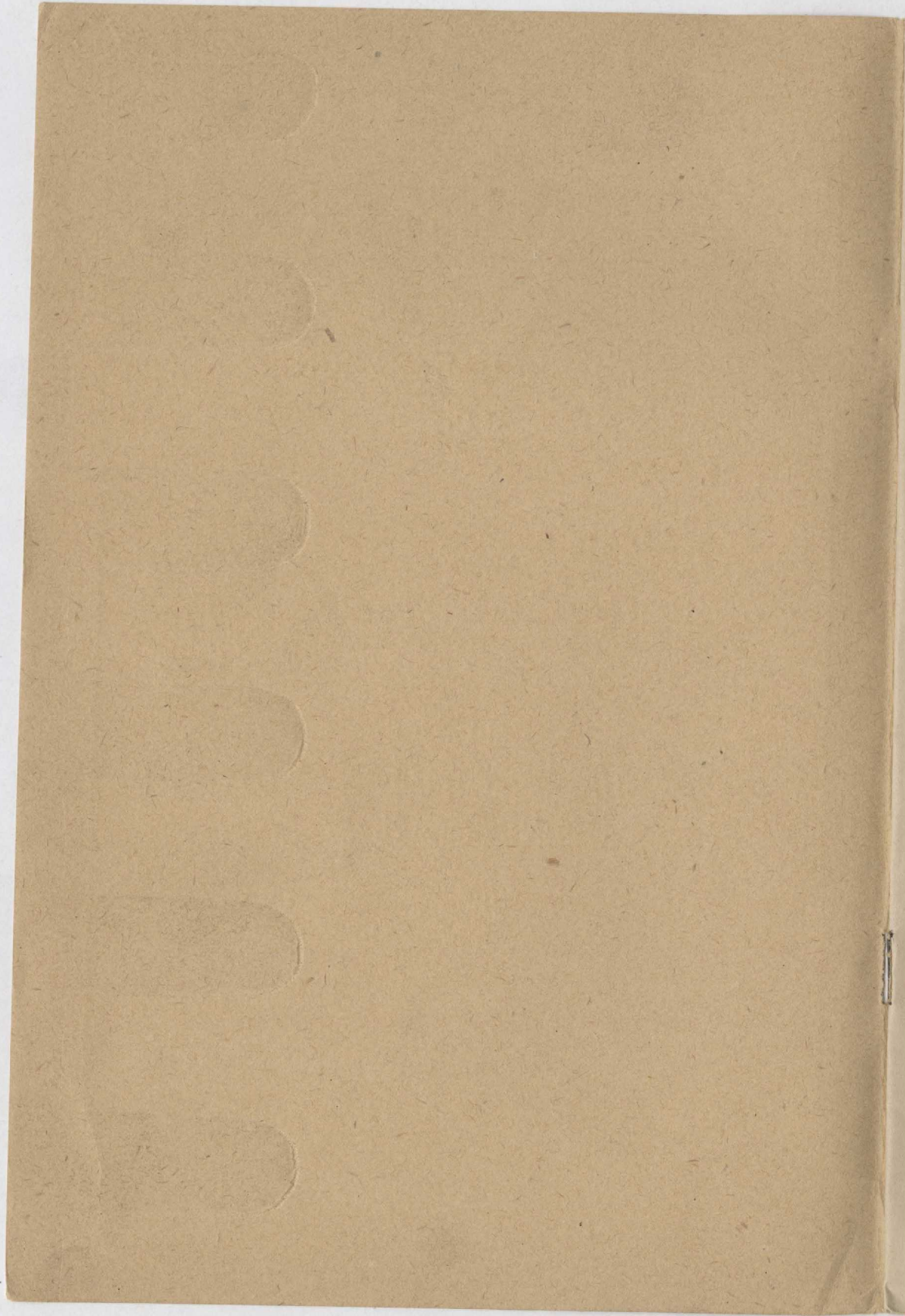

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PROCEEDINGS

The 153d Annual Session of the Kehukee Primitive Baptist Association Held With the Church at Falls Tar River, Oct. 5th, 6th and 7th, 1918.

The introductory sermon was preached by B. S. Cowin from St. Mark 13:34.

After a short intermission the Association came together and was organized by appointing Elder Sylvester Hassell moderator and B. S. Cowin clerk, who called to his assistance Brethren W. H. Daniel and W. H. Worsley.

It is agreed that if any member of this association be present at any other association with which we correspond that he is authorized to represent this association.

Resolved: First—That this association discountenances, condemns and forbids all kinds of trading and misbehavior on or around the association grounds while

in session and will endeavor to punish the same to the full extent of the law, and that it recommends to the churches composing the association that they have their places of worship incorporated to protect them from lawlessness.

It is agreed that this association return thanks to God for excellent weather and all other blessings, and to the brethren, sisters and friends of the entire community for their liberal hospitality in the entertainment of this association, and to Mr. T. H. Battle for the use of the park in which the association was held.

Agreed that the clerk have 2000 copies of these minutes and 1000 letters printed and sent to him for distribution among the church of this association and the associations with which we correspond; that he record a copy on our records, and that he be allowed \$15.00 for his services.

There being no other business before the association it was adjourned to the time and place appointed with singing and benediction by the moderator.

About thirty ministers of other associations from Maine to Texas have met with us; and those of them who have preached to us have ably and edifyingly proclaimed the joyful tidings of a free and full, a holy and

everlasting salvation of all the chosen people of God by the infinite grace of God, the atoning death and justifying resurrection of His Son, and the regenerating and sanctifying power of His Spirit.

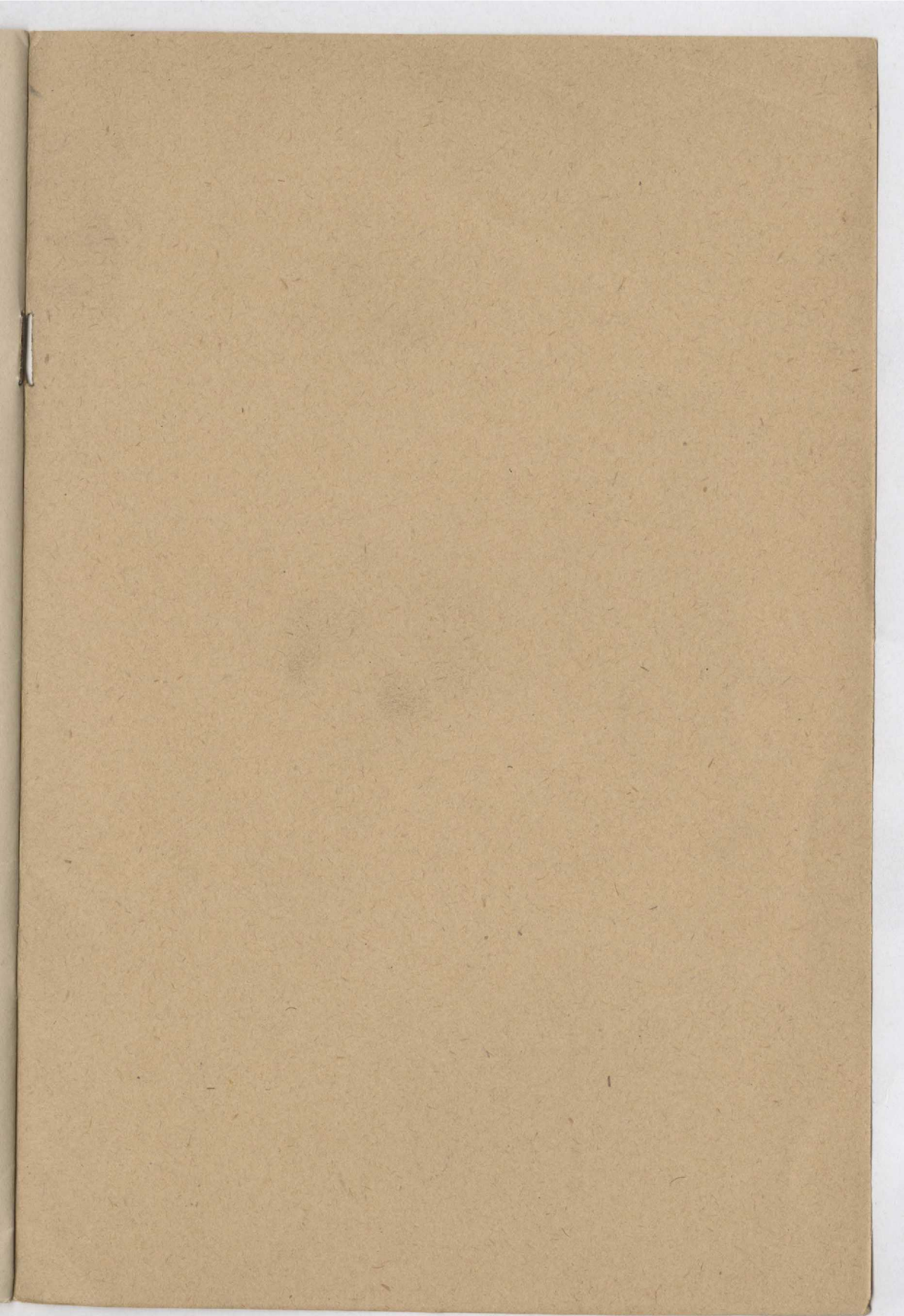
