KEESEEE FUND CHANGES:

The seminary has just received notification of a significant change in the qualifications for future recipients of financial assistance from the Charles B. Keeseee Educational Fund. Beginning with new applicants for aid during summer school or for the 1982-83 academic year, the Keeseee Fund will be able to consider applications only from residents of N.C. or Virginia. Residency is determined by the state of residence prior to entering Southeastern. This new ruling will not apply to non-resident students currently in school and who have previously received assistance from the Fund. This change was made necessary due to the Fund's income not increasing proportionately with rising educational expenses. Southern Baptist students who meet the new residency requirements and who will be fulltime students (10 hours-M.Div., MRE or 12 hours - A.Div.) should begin the application process soon. Deadlines to submit applications are March 1 for Summer school and April 15 for Fall & Spring semesters. Information for contacting the fund is available from the Student Affairs office.
