

THE MARIETTA OLD SCHOOL PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

SIXTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL SESSION

Convened with the Church at Bethany, in Atlanta, Georgia, September 30, October 1-2, 1927.

INTRODUCTORY SERMON

PETITIONARY LETTER FROM THE WEST ATLANTA CHURCH

We, the West Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church, to the Ministers and Messengers Composing the Marietta Old School Primitive Baptist Association, Greeting:

Dearly Beloved in the Lord: We send this, our petitionary letter, to you desiring admission into your body, by the hands of Eld. Lee Hanks, Brethren J. A. Middlebrooks, W. T. Webb and C. R. Garner. This letter will inform you that we are in peace among ourselves and with all sister Churches of like precious faith. We have the Gospel preached to us in its purity by our beloved and esteemed pastor, Eld. W. T. Walden, and others. We, as a Church, hold to the faith and practice upon which ours, and all orthodox Primitive Baptist Churches were constituted, to-wit:

"THE SOVEREIGNTY OF GOD; PREDESTINATION AS TAUGHT IN THE BIBLE (Rom. 8:29-30), (Eph. 1:5), (2 Tim. 1:9), (John 15:16), (1 Thess. 5:9); ELECTION OF A DEFINITE NUMBER OF ADAM'S RACE TO GRACE AND GLORY (Eph. 1:4), (Peter 1:1-5), (Psalms 65:4), (2 Thess. 2:13); TOTAL DEPRAVITY OF ALL HUMAN BEINGS IN A STATE OF NATURE (Rom. 3:9-23, 5:12); THAT JESUS, ON THE CROSS, made a special atonement for all the sins of all His people; that all

for whom Christ made satisfaction shall be effectually called, regenerated, preserved by grace, resurrected and glorified in heaven independent of any human means or instrumentalities. We believe the Primitive Baptist to be the Organic Church of God, and as such should stand aloof from all institutions of men, religious or secret oath bound. We, as a Church, ratified your Corresponding letter, 1926, in closing your doors against

"Arminianism, Russellism, and the Absolute Predestination of Sin and Wickedness, which was the doctrine of the Nicolaitans and the Heathen Mohamit."

On account of you and our Church refusing to fellowship that absolute heresy, the Yellow River Association refused to allow our letter read at their last session, Friday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1927, stating that it would be "a bomb in the camps," and it was advocated on the floor in the Association by one of their preachers, that God predestined sin and wickedness. Our messengers denounced said heresy and withdrew from the Association, because The Yellow River of their official alliance with that doctrine. dropped the Marietta because of their condemnation of that heresy. We love the Yellow River Brethren and do trust that they will rid themselves of that fatalistic doctrine which makes the child of God as an irresponsible machine, under a physical law, and makes no distinction between foreknowledge and predestination, and makes God the predestinator of all sin and wickedness, and leaves the devil without an office.

We believe in good works as taught in the Bible to spiritually born children of God, and that God's children need the grace of God continually, but God is with His people and furnishes them enabling grace to do whatever He commands them to do, and they are blessed in the doing and chastised for their disobedience. We, as a Church, want "the old paths" and are unwilling to accept the perverse doctrines of men. Preaching the truth unifies and heresy destroys the organic life of the Church.

We do pray that God may be with you all in your Association, and that sweet love and harmony may abound.
