INTERNSHIPS IN CAMPUS Dr. James Greene, Director of N.C. Department of MINISTRIES: Campus Ministry has announced that there will be at least four vacancies in Campus Ministry that

will be filled by Interns during the 1976-77 School year. Locations under consideration for these Internships include UNC-Chapel Hill, UNC-Greensboro, UNC-Charlotte, N.C. State, Western Carolina, and Wake Forest University. Southeastern students who have completed at least half of their M.Div. Program of studies, and who are selected for one of these Internships, may be registered for the course M337-Advanced Practicum In Campus Ministry, and be granted eight hours per

semester credit for this experience. The Internship is a full time "in-service-training" ministry. Competent supervision under a Campus Minister and Dr. Greene is provided. Housing and a \$200.00 per month (for 9 months) scholarship are available for each Intern.

Dr. Greene will be on the Southeastern Campus throughout the day, on March 3, 1976, to interview those interested in an Internship.
