

A meeting was held in New Orleans on July 2, 1976 which could affect positively the plans for a national campaign later this decade to endow the six Southern Baptist Seminaries. The presidents met with trustee chairmen, denominational leaders and SBC executive committee officers, along with a consultant, to discuss a wide range of matters related to the proposed national campaign. The following motion was passed to be submitted to the Southern Baptist Executive Committee at its September meeting:

SPECIAL SEMINARY CAMPAIGN

"That this (study) committee recommend to the SBC seminary campaign subcommittee that a national cooperative campaign be authorized in which the six seminaries conduct parallel campaigns with a national theme. To implement the campaign, a committee of 15 members, including the six seminary presidents, be named by the Southern Baptist Convention President. This committee will determine ground rules, secure necessary consultation, initiate and coordinate the campaign in keeping with Article VI of the Business and Financial Plan of the Southern Baptist Convention. Expenses of the campaign will be shared by the six seminaries."
