The guest lecturer for the Adams Lectures on Preaching and the Practice of Ministry is Dr.

Gene E. Bartlett. Presently serving as pastor of the First Baptist Church, Newton Centre, Mass., Dr. Bartlett has served churches in New York, Missouri, Illinois and California. From 1960-70 he was president of Colgate-Rochester Divinity School, and served as president of the American Baptist Churchs, U.S.A. from 1972-73. Dr. Bartlett has lectured widely and is the author of three books, including The Audacity of Preaching, The News in Religion, and These Are the Baptists.
