

MINUTES.

The sixty-third annual session of the Harmony Primitive Baptist Association was held with the church at Slaughter Creek, Stewart county, Georgia, October 11th, 12th and 13th, 1901.

The introductory was preached by Elder Lee Hanks of the Flint River Association Text, Rev., 11 chapter, 1st and 2nd verses, "And there was given

me a reed like unto a rod," etc.

After an intermission of one hour the messenger assembled in the house and the association was called to order by our moderator, Brother B. F. Markett. After singing, prayer by Licentrate J. M. Murray of the Upatoie Association.

Then called for letters and heard letters read from 15 churches and minuted their state. Then went into choice of moderator and clerk by ballot, which resulted in the election of Brother B. F. Markett for moderator and R. H. Jennings clerk.

Called for petitionary letters.

Invited visiting brethren and ministers to seats with us.

Called the roll and omitted reading decorum.

Called for correspondence and received from the Upatoie Elder W. Riner, Licentrates D. F. Woodall, J. M. Murray, Brethren K. Stewart, E. T. Leightner with minutes.

Heard report of committee on business. Recommended old minutes as a guide. Report received.

Renewed call for correspondence.

Called for report of committee to examine correspondence. Committee reported that it found nothing claiming the attention of the association. ReReturned correspondence to the sister associations.

Agreed to have 900 minutes printed, 750 for the churches, 150 for correspondence and after printing and mailing the same the clerk to keep the remainder for his services. On motion agreed to have articles of faith printed in minutes.

Called for correspondence letter, which was read and adopted. "We the Harmony Association now in session at Slaughter Creek church do by vote extend to the church and neighborhood our sincere thanks

for kindness and hospitality shown us."

Appointed the next session of our meeting to be with Bluff Springs church, Macon county, Ga., 4 miles from Anderson at our usual time at 10:30 a.m., Friday before second Sunday in October next. Read minutes and adjourned to stand. Closed Sunday afternoon. Prayer by Elder J. W. Parker of Chocktawhatchee. B. F. Markett, Moderator. Parker of Chocktawhatchee. R. H. Jennings, Clerk.

ABSTRACT OF FAITH.

ART. 1. We believe in one only true and living God, and that there are three persons in the God Head: the Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

ART. 2. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments

are the Word of God and the only rule of Faith and Practice.

ART. 3. We believe in the doctrine of particular and eternal election.

ART. 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

ART. 5. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by his own free will and ability.

ART. 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by

the imputed righteousness of Christ.

Arr. 7. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.

ART. 8. We believe that saints shall persevere in grace, and never final-

ly fall away.

ART. 9. We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and Washing the Saints' Feet are ordinances, and we believe that the true mode of Baptism is by Immersion.

ART. 10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judg-

ment.

ART. 11. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be everlast-

ing and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

ART. 12 We believe that no minister has the right to the administration of the ordinances, only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hand by the Presbytery.
