(3) Students must be taking classes on the W-F seminary campus to qualify for Keesee. Hours taken at Shelby do not qualify. * The Trustees of the Charles B. Keesee Fund have approved the Holy Land Tour course, B 1030 for Keesee funding provided the student participating in the course is encoded for funding provided the student participating in the course is enrolled for <u>sufficient hours to meet the requirement for full-time students including the</u> <u>four hours credit given for this course.</u> Students enrolled in CPE or Intern Year Away program <u>do not qualify</u> for any funds (4) Classes must be taken during the full fall or spring semester. Hours taken during Interterm classes and spring or fall break do not qualify as Keesee hours.
