Ches Smith '54 of Tifton, Georgia was elected Chairman of the SBC Executive Committee, and Bill Self '57 of Atlanta, Georgia was selected to preach the Convention sermon next year in Kansas City.

New Southeastern trustees elected by the SBC are Mrs. Peggy Branch of Cary, North Carolina and Dr. Bill Hudgens of Edwardsville, Illinois.

W. Perry Crouch will join the staff at Southeastern on August 1 as a Development Counselor. Dr. Crouch, recently retired as General Secretary-Treasurer of the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, will give counsel to prospective donors on behalf of

Two of the committees of Southeastern's Board of Trustees, the Executive and Finance Committees, met on the campus on July 1. Their meeting resulted in the following actions:

1. Election of Dr. Alan P. Neely to the faculty in Christian Missions.
2. Revised rental fees and added a late matriculation fee.
3. Approved an enabling action for a Development Council.
4. Approved a record, \$2,126,230, budget for fiscal 1976-77. Included in the budget is a revised faculty salary scale.
5. Approved the designation of \$6000 per annum for ordained persons' housing allowance.
6. Approved plans for completing the library construction project, including furniture, fixtures, and equipment.
