"Arabati," a film depicting severe famine conditions, will be shown at 10:00 AM in Adams 101. Binkley 103 will be set aside as a prayer room from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Various campus groups will lead in special prayer times each hour. One way to respond will be to fast and give the money you would have spent for a meal to the relief efforts. By participating as a community in prayer, fasting, and giving, we will be faithful to Christ who lives among the hungry.

FAMINE RELIEF EFFORT: The Southeastern community has opportunity to help with the relief efforts of the Foreign Mission Board in response to the African famine.
