We have now in foreign fields about 100 missionaries, 80 under the Board and about twenty sent out by the churches. We earnestly request the churches increase their contributions and give as the Lord has prospered them and where He directs, that we may have a part in the great work of making the "kingdoms of the world the king-J. ORPHANAGE.

There are one hundred and seventy-five children at the Baptist Orphanage at this time. The health record of the institution for the past year was remarkable, the physician's bill having been less than \$50. The favor of the Lord has rested richly on the work. The physical, moral and spiritual welfare of the children is looked after with intelligent and constant care. The institution is in excellent financial shape and is steadily growing in the sympathy and love of our people. We are glad to report the continued economy of the management of the institution. A little less than \$5 per month per capita covers all the cost, and in this estimate the salaries of the employees are included besides the food and clothing of the children. We have some eighteen buildings on the grounds valued at \$20,-000. A new nursery for children from 5 to 8 years of age will be completed by December first, which will greatly increase the efficiency of the work, A machine shop for the instruction of the boys in mechanics, and erected as a memorial to the late John H. Mills, will be erected in the near future. We commend the enterprise to the brethren and hope it will receive their sympathy and help. Many children are clamoring for admission, and they are just as needy and as worthy as those already there, but they cannot be a lmitted unless the current fund is increased. This must be done by the churches and Sunday Schools if it is done at all. We urge our churches to enlarge their contributions to meet the growing needs of the work. We recommend that our Sunday Schools devote one Sunday in each month to a collection for this blessed cause.
