TUCKASEIGEE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION **Proceedings of 193rd Annual Meetings**

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 11, 2022

1. Cashiers Baptist Church hosted the first session of the 193rd Annual Meeting of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association. It began at 6:00 p.m. A total of 61 present: 38 Messengers and 23 visitors representing 14 churches.

2. Dennis Proffitt, Moderator, welcomed everyone.

3. Carol Tomblin of Cashier Baptist Church welcomed everyone to the church and their praise band provided special music. They encouraged everyone to sing along. Pastor Hayward Tomblin had eye surgery that day and could not attend.

4. Rev. Kent Lowdermilk, pastor of Buff Creek Baptist Church, preached the opening sermon from Hebrews 10:24-25. He emphasized that encouragement is essential and everyone needs to be doing it. 5. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "The Old Rugged Cross."

6. The 193rd Annual Meeting was called to order by Dennis Proffitt, Moderator.

7. The Order of Business was adopted.

8. No new pastors or visitors were recognized. However, all the pastors were asked to stand and be recognized: Rev. Hunter Gosnell, Rev. Kent Lowdermilk, Rev. Avery Brown and Rev. Scott Carter.

COMMITTEES

9. Stewardship -Hollye Moss presented the proposed 2022-2023 budget to be voted on Thursday. The budget is on page 10. She said that the total expenses were \$2,236.31 over the funds received for the budget and this year's budget would be increased by \$1.814.61.

10. Nominating Committee - David Dalton presented their report on page 13. No further nominations were made and the Nominating Committee List was approved.

11. Annual Meeting Committee - Place and Preacher- Laura Brown presented the Place and Preacher recommendations for 2023. It was approved.

12. Laura Brown presented a thank you to Cashiers Baptist, Rev. Kent Lowdermilk, Lighthouse Baptist, Rev. Justin Hall and officers and volunteers in the association for their work in the association this year. 13. Memorials - Laura Brown read the names of members from each church that had passed away during the past year.

14. Miscellaneous Business - Rev. Gerald Morris brought a motion from the Building and Grounds committee that the Association accept a \$3,450 estimate from Jeff Polson Tree Care to remove two dead oak trees and trim two limbs off another oak tree that are hanging over the roof of the Baptist Center. This motion was approved.

REPORTS

15. Director of Missions - Rev. Gerald Morris presented his report starting on page 3.

16. Music - David Dalton presented his report on page 9. He said that he and Grace Morris were elected to be the co-music directors about three years ago. But they were unable to do anything, because COVID hit in 2020. The first Associational singing was held again in the spring of this year with four churches participating. The offering collected was divided between the association and Broyhill Children's Home. On October 16 the Fall Singing is scheduled and seven churches are scheduled to participate. He encouraged other churches to start their choirs again like his church has just recently.

MISSION REPORTS

17. Webster Baptist - The video to be presented by Renee Peoples who is serving in Slovenia was unable to be shown due to technical difficulties.

18. La Primera Iglesia Bautista De Amor – Julian Mora presented some pictures and told about their trips to Mississippi and Mexico.

19. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "Footsteps of Jesus."

20. Baptists on Mission of NC - Rob Hood told about the work being done in Haywood County after the flooding from last year. They have cleaned and are rebuilding houses. People with all skill levels are needed. He said the Baptist workers are making a difference in the community. Community members have made marveled at the joy they show as they are working to get them back in their homes. 21. Benny Rice led the benediction prayer.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 13, 2022

1. Lighthouse Baptist Church hosted the second session of the 193rd Annual Meeting of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association. It began at 6:00 p.m. A total of 51 present: 38 Messengers and 13 visitors representing 13 churches.

2. Dennis Proffitt, Moderator, welcomed everyone.

- 3. Pastor Mark Rogers of Lighthouse Baptist welcomed everyone.
- 4. Stewardship Hollye Moss presented the Proposed Budget and it was approved.
- 5. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "Heaven's Jubilee."
- 6. WMU Report Tracy Salter presented her report on page 9.

7. <u>Adult and Teen Challenge</u> – Mike Barres present some slides and testimonies from men in their program. It is a 12 month addiction recovery program with discipleship training.

8. <u>Senior Center</u> – Dennis Proffitt said Gail Cagle (director of the senior center) was unable to be at the meeting. However, he presented a personal testimony of how the senior center had been such a help to his family with his mom while she had dementia. Some of the senior activities include, fishing, getting their hair done, games, a daily lunch and a weekly devotion led by Rev. Scott Carter of Webster Baptist.

9. United Christian Ministries - Joyce Pope presented her report on page 24.

10. <u>Registration</u> - For the 2 nights there were 53 messengers and 16 churches represented. There were approximately 34 visitors.

11. Ochre Hill - Kim Fiskeaux said the church has continued their partnership with NC Baptist on Mission and 14 people went to work in Fredonia, KY this past summer. The crew worked in the tornado devastated area to help rebuild 2 houses. The youth in the group also shared balloons with scripture cards. Ochre Hill also continues to operate the Lord's Closet. They provide a hot meal, food boxes and devotion on the 4th Wednesday of the month. They are feeding the soul.

12. <u>Lighthouse</u> – Ruthie Salter spoke about their church taking a group to Deep Impact at Fort Caswell, NC. They were involved in construction projects, beach/volleyball gospel conversations and servant evangelism. They were taught to be bold in their faith to share the Gospel.

13. <u>Buff Creek</u> – MaKellyn Mathis told about the Deep Impact and Deep Impact Kids programs provided by the NC Baptists on Mission. Deep Impact offers prepackaged mission trips for middle and high school age kids. Deep Impact Kids offer prepackaged mission trips for 1st-6th graders. It is mission focused and a great outreach program. She said the kids are encouraged to go home and do what they did on their mission trips in their own communities.

14. <u>Webster</u> – Renee Peoples sent a video to Gerald to present at the annual meeting about her voluntary missionary journey in Slovenia. She has moved there and is working with some IMB missionaries to share the Gospel in multiple ways.

15. David Dalton led the congregation in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms."

16. Rev. Justin Hall, pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, preached the closing sermon about the need to share the Gospel message from Acts 4.

17. Rev. Scott Carter led the benediction prayer.

DOM Annual Report 2021-2022, Rev. Gerald Morris

This report is an addition to the three quarterly reports that can be found at the end of this report.

This year has been, like the last few years, one of change, and maybe this time for the better. The worst of COVID seems to now be behind us and people are now shedding some of the fear that has clouded our society for the last two years. All of the churches of the Association have begun to fully open with live worship services even as some continue to host online services. Even as we progress toward "normal", some things will never return to what they once were.

Since churches throughout the Association have returned to the church for worship, in most but not all services, I have observed two things. First of all, several churches have discontinued or not restarted their Sunday evening services. The Second observation is that most of the churches have experienced a decrease in Sunday morning attendance often to the point of losing a quarter to a third of their pre-COVID attendance.

Those two observations aside, all churches have returned to meeting together and this has helped me in my visitation of the churches. In the past, I have been able to visit every church at least once a year and most twice. I am working toward that pace now again.

This quarter has been busy once again. The main emphasis for me this quarter has been preparation for the tenth Annual Missions Conference and the Mountain Heritage Day outreach at WCU.

Just as previous years, I begin to prepare for the Missions Conference in January when I request missionary speakers for the dates that have been set and then wait. This quarter is consumed with scheduling missionary speakers for each church, confirming hotel rooms, correspondence with missionaries, planning our "tour guide" days, etc. Each year I look back at the Conference and think that it was the best that we have hosted and this year is no exception. The speakers were great and one church commented to me that the Missions Conference was "better than a revival". I know that Gracella and I come away from it challenged to do more for God. After the Conference I can quickly wrap up what I have done, but Gracella's job has just begun. Post-conference is the time for her to collect all of the offerings so she can pay the hotel, distribute to the missionaries checks to reimburse them for their travel expenses and a check for an honorarium. This year, like every other year, the churches were very generous with their love offerings so the Association could be generous with the honorarium checks.

The second biggest event for this quarter is the outreach at Mountain Heritage Day at WCU. We rented a booth in the vendors' area as a non-profit organization. We prepared or ordered several items to hand out to those that passed by our booth. We had two types of cookbooks (one for desserts and one for Ramen recipes), church fans, children's activity sheets, church produced information sheets, etc. Everything that we distributed had the Gospel clearly presented. The handouts also afforded us the opportunity to talk with those that received the handouts. We were able to talk briefly with hundreds of people with the opportunity to talk in depth with some. We were able to invite several college students to our churches. We now pray for the seeds that were planted that day.

The restart of nursing home visitation has been moving along with some struggles. The churches that have gone to the nursing home have been blessed and reported that the residents are so hungry for more. The number of churches that have volunteered is limited so there is a need for more churches to step up and help. I know that many churches have not restarted their choirs, but that is not required for you to help. If you can get a small group to go and sing and have a short devotion, the residents (and you) will be blessed and each church will not have to go so many times in the year.

Gracella has been busy helping Jackson County Bible Clubs restart as the new school year begins. The Bible Clubs have spread the Gospel for over 20 years and is a vital outreach to the unchurched children in our elementary schools.

With the restart of churches meeting in person, we have received a large amount of Sunday School literature for BookLink WNC to process. We held a workday in September with several people coming to help sort and pack the material in preparation to deliver to BookLink International in Kentucky. We have a large amount of prepared literature that needs to be delivered to them soon.

There are many more smaller things that Gracella and I have been busy doing than I can describe in this report. Some of those things would be - counseling pastors and pulpit committees, alerting churches to grant opportunities to help fund their ministries, offering a class in church revitalization, attending a creation seminar at Webster Baptist, maintaining the Association's van and building, preaching for pastors that are sick or on vacation, preparing for the Annual meeting, meeting with area DOMs and the Executive Director of the State Convention, and others things that are confidential.

Each year, as I sit down to write this report I am amazed that God allows us to serve Him by serving the wonderful churches of this Association. I have had the pleasure to serve for more than 12 years and it does not seem like it has been that long. I believe God has great things planned for His churches and we have to be sure to listen and obey Him so that we can reach Jackson County and the World with the wonderful message of Jesus.

Director of Missions Quarterly Report, July 2022

This last quarter has been a time of drastic and welcome change. The COVID outbreak seems to, for the most part, be retreating into the past, only raising its ugly head sporadically. The retreat of this scourge has allowed churches to begin to have regular services again and hold events like revivals and Vacation Bible School. With what seems like a new beginning in the churches, the Association has become busier also.

One of the ways that the Association has seen the results of this new beginning is that we have seen an increase in the use of our loaner equipment. The popcorn, sno-cone and cotton candy machines have been loaned out for various events, especially VBS. The Associational van has been used several times going from Deep Creek to Mississippi. It is always wonderful to be able to loan this equipment out to the churches with minimal expense.

Another way that Gracella and I have been busy this quarter is our privilege to help a couple of churches in their ministries. We were able to help El Centro del Señior with their Youth Conference held in June. El Centro hosted the Hispanic churches throughout Western North Carolina for a time to learn how to have faith that God's Word is true. They had over 250 youth and parents in attendance. We also were able to help Cullowhee Valley Baptist during one of their Monday food distributions when several of the church members were out of town. It is always a pleasure to help churches with their ministry needs in any way that we can.

With the return to regular services, I have been able to visit churches more than I have since the Spring of 2020. I always enjoy visiting Associational churches and worshiping with the congregation. One way that you could help me greatly is to let me know what times your church is meeting. With the shake-up that has happened in the last two years, churches are meeting at different times and have canceled some services altogether.

I have also had the honor to preach several times this quarter, once on short notice. One morning I was praying about which church to visit when I received a call a little after 8 a.m. It was a call from a deacon at a church whose pastor had called him, unable to preach. If your church ever finds itself in this situation, don't hesitate to call no matter what time it is. I am always ready to preach for your pastor if he is sick, on vacation, or just needs a break.

During the Easter season this April, I attended a presentation on the Passover Sedar hosted by Lighthouse and presented by Jews for Jesus. I also was able to present a Passover Sedar at Little Savannah. They have been studying the feasts of the Old Testament and wanted to participate in the Sedar for the Easter season. I have presented this Sedar for Christians in the past and was excited to share it again. I would be glad to share this with your church.

As life returns back to normal, training opportunities and meeting obligations have returned. I traveled to the Avery Baptist Association to check out the Baptist State Convention's Revitalization Intensive course with the possibility of hosting it here. I found it was focused more on the "business" side of revitalizing a church than I wanted for our Association. I am working on getting together some material to host our own classes on church revitalization.

In April, I met with Mark Smith of the Baptist Children's Home of NC. He is the new coordinator for the Every Home Foster and Adoption services. He shared with me how the Children's Home is helping Baptists throughout the state become foster and adoptive parents. Their ultimate goal is that every child in the foster care system has a home with a baptist family. He would love to speak with your church about how the Children's Homes can help.

I have met with a few prospective pastors and interim pastors in the last month. I hope to match them up with churches that could use their services. We now have three churches that are searching for a pastor. I am also in meetings with one church that is contemplating shutting down for good. Please pray for this church as they make such an important decision.

Once again, we hosted the Food Roundup for the Broyhill Children's home. This year we collected quite a bit less food but significantly more gift cards from grocery stores. In many ways, this is better because it allows the cottage parents to buy what they need when they need it.

A good bit of what we have been doing is preparing for future Associational events. The event that takes up the most time each year is the Fall Missions Conference coming up August 28-31. This year we have eleven churches in three different Associations participating. We have almost all of the missionaries signed up to come. I have also been helping the WMU of Macon Baptist Association to start a Mission Conference of their own. This year they will have two churches host a missionary on Sunday night. I would invite you to find one of the host churches and attend so you can see what God is doing through our IMB missionaries.

Another event that we have been preparing for is the outreach on Mountain Heritage Day which will occur on September 24th. The Association will host a booth that will spotlight the churches of the Association. We plan to have information for each of the churches available along with several things to share the Gospel. We would like to have you come and help man the booth so you can invite people to your church. At the least, please send us information about your church so we can share it with the thousands of people that will visit that day.

Gracella has been very busy this quarter working on restarting the rest home visitation program. After contacting all four rest/nursing homes in the county about the possibility of churches returning to visiting on Sunday afternoon, Morning Star and the Hermitage agreed to allow churches back in. Gracella then contacted all of the churches that participated in the past to see who would be willing and able to do so again. She then worked on a schedule that would fit around Homecomings and other events on the participating churches' calendars. This is a very important ministry to the residents of these homes and we are glad to see it return. If your church is not signed up and is willing to help, she needs a few that would be willing to fill in when a church cannot go.

As you can see from reading the above report, the Association is once again becoming busy helping churches serve the Lord. May we all become busy sharing the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to this lost and dying world.

Director of Missions April 2022 Quarterly Report

As we have seen the level of COVID restrictions being lifted, the activity of the Association has increased in various ways this last quarter.

As usual, I have spent Sundays and Wednesdays either preaching or visiting member churches. It is great to see more churches being able to meet inside instead of in the parking lot and many are returning to evening services on Sunday and Wednesday. One challenge that continues for me is knowing when each church has begun to meet Sunday or Wednesday evenings. Please let me know when your church is meeting and what times you are meeting.

It is always an honor to preach and this quarter has been, once again, busy. I preached several times for churches that are currently without a pastor and a few times for pastors that were not able to preach due to illness.

Gracella and I took a trip to Eubank, Ky to deliver a van load of literature to BookLink Int. Mr. and Mrs. Williams were grateful for the materials. They are working on a load to go to Zambia. Due to their age and the continued circulation of COVID, they are not able to host large volunteer groups but are working themselves with a few volunteers to keep packing the material.

This year I am working on bringing the churches together for worship and fellowship. It was wonderful to be able to host the Spring Singing after having to cancel the previous ones. While the number of churches that were able to participate was smaller than in previous years (due to many churches still not having a choir) the churches that were able to gather at New Hope Baptist came together for a beautiful time of worship.

Another time of gathering for worship came in March when the Association hosted Dr. Paul Chitwood, president of the International Mission Board. He spoke at El Centro del Senor and Lovedale Baptist. His message was informative, encouraging and challenging. He shared his testimony of how he was saved and how he became the president of the IMB. He then shared how the IMB is sharing the Gospel throughout the world and especially to the Ukrainians during this tumultuous time. He challenged attendees by reminding us that the greatest need that everyone has is the need for salvation from their sins.

In an effort to increase the fellowship between the churches, we hosted a meal for the pastors and their wives here at the Baptist Center. There were eight of us that gathered for a meal and conversation. The current plan is to host a meal each quarter so that we can come together and get to know each other better.

I am looking at different local, state and national mission opportunities that the Association can offer. If you and/or your church is interested in going on a mission trip, please let me know.

The Annual Missions Conference is planned for August 28th. If you are interested in hosting a missionary for the evening or morning service, please let me know ASAP.

I have been attending several meetings with other DOM's following the changes that have occurred in the Baptist State Convention since they hired a new Executive Director. I have also been searching for training opportunities for the Association.

With the retreat of COVID, churches have been able to return to doing ministry inside and outside of the church. It is exciting to see what God does through the churches of the Association as we search for new ways to reach our community.

Director of Missions January 2022 Quarterly Report

This latest quarter began with a pair of wonderful Annual Meetings in October. Each time we meet I am encouraged and thankful for the strengthening cooperation and fellowship between the churches in the Association. Like everyone else, I will be so glad when this pandemic finally moves on through and we can meet together as an Association in more ways like we have in the past.

There are a couple of Associational gatherings I would like to go ahead and try to hold this Spring and one in the Fall. The first is a tradition that many churches have enjoyed for many years, the Spring Singing. This year I propose we plan to hold the Singings on March 6th for the churches that feel comfortable gathering and singing together. Like everything else these last two years, the plans would be subject to change and open to those that feel comfortable participating. Maybe even the host churches could stream it live so others could enjoy the event without having to be there in person.

The second event that I would like to move ahead with this Spring is hosting Paul Chitwood, president of the International Mission Board. He is scheduled to come March 20th at 6pm and Lovedale Baptist has agreed to host the event. Their sanctuary is large enough that we should be able to give people the distance that they need to feel safe. I think it would be nice to hear from Dr. Chitwood and see what the plans for the IMB are in the future and his heart for reaching the nations with the Good News.

The Fall event that I referred to, is the Missions Conference. This will be our 10th annual Conference. In the previous nine years, we have had the honor of hosting 40 IMB missionary units (the term that the IMB uses to refer to a missionary and their family). Each year Gracella and I finish the Conference with the feeling that it has been the best ever. It has been a blessing to hear how God is using ordinary people that are willing to be obedient to God to share the Gospel in the hardest places. Right now the plan is to hold the Conference August 28-31. Just like our 2021 Conference, there will be two options to participate - host a missionary for one service on Sunday or host five missionaries Sunday morning to Wednesday evening. Please let me know ASAP so I know the number of missionaries that I need to request from the IMB. I will be contacting them this month to request missionaries.

The van that Cashiers Baptist so graciously donated to the Association is available for churches to borrow. Four churches have borrowed it so far. It has been to Alarka, Hendersonville and Atlanta. It was used by churches with no van and one with a van but with more people going than their van could accommodate. Please contact Gracella or me for information about how to borrow the van. I am excited to add the van to the multitude of resources the Association offers to its member churches. Other resources include - popcorn machine, sno-cone machine, cotton candy machine, VBS resources, Advent candles, white candles for candle-light service, book binding machine, laminating machine, sample Sunday School materials, Jesus videos, Gospel tract samples and more.

After an extended collection time, I was able to process and recycle keys that were donated to the Association. The total for the collected keys was \$38.25.

I was honored to be invited to participate in an ordination counsel at La Primera Bautista as they questioned Efrain Fernandez in preparation to ordain him into the pastoral ministry. The ordination was held January 9th but I was not able to attend because of a family obligation.

Much of the time during this quarter has been planning for the new year. In the near future, I hope to schedule informational/ planning meetings to determine the interest in a few projects for 2022. First, I would like to see if there is interest in scheduling a regular time for pastors to get

together for fellowship (and maybe even food). I would love to find a regular time that would bring together every pastor, bi-vocational and full time.

Second, I would like to set up a meeting to determine the interest in various missions opportunities. One of which would involve helping the victims of the Haywood County flooding. Another is a possible mission trip to another raceway ministry. I am open to helping plan/ lead other mission trips if someone has a desire to go.

And finally, I would like to meet to determine the interest in holding classes here in the Association for Bible and church leadership classes. I have been in discussion with Fruitland for several years about hosting classes here in English (just as they do in Spanish) but to no avail. I would like to come together to study the Bible and other church leadership issues as the group desires. The meeting would be to explore various educational opportunities and I would like feedback.

I continue to work toward visiting each church yearly but with the new waves of COVID it has been difficult. When you can, please let me know when your church changes meeting times or even cancels services.

I say what I have said many times before, it is an honor and privilege to serve the Lord by serving the churches of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association.

BY-LAWS OF THE TUCKASEIGEE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION, INC.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of the body shall be the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association, Incorporated.

ARTICLE II. OBJECTIVES

The purpose of the Association is to be a fellowship of churches on mission in our setting. The specific objectives of the Association are as follows:

1. To promote harmony, understanding and spiritual power between the churches.

2. To afford and promote a larger fellowship of Christians in the work of Christ.

3. To provide such programs, projects and organizations as will strengthen the churches and assist them in achieving their goals and objectives.

4. To discover needs which cannot be met effectively by churches individually and to coordinate the use of resources in meeting these needs.

5. To encourage support by every church for the mission causes of the Association, the North Carolina Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III. AUTHORITY

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the power to elect and install its officers in whatever manner the body may deem expedient.

SECTION 2. The Association shall have power to recommend measures of usefulness and guidance to our churches in matters of organization, ordinations and questions of doctrines and discipline,

SECTION 3. The Association shall have no power to infringe upon the right of local churches as autonomous bodies.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The Association shall be composed of regularly constituted Baptist churches in cooperating fellowship with the Southern Baptist Convention and following the teachings of the Bible.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive or reject churches applying for membership therein at its pleasure. Churches applying for membership shall agree to come under the watchcare of the Association for one year. It is understood that during this period of watchcare the church shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except those of voting.

Applications for membership shall be presented to the Doctrine Committee of the Association. The applications will consist of a letter from a constituted church stating their desire to affiliate with the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association. The Doctrine Committee as a part of the review process may invite the requesting church to a conference to discuss its history, its mission strategy, and any other information that may be pertinent to the application. The Doctrine Committee may then approve the application and recommend them to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee may by a simple majority vote accept the requesting church to come under the watchcare of the Association for one year. Any church under watchcare is expected to participate in and financially support the Association. At the end of the year, the church may be voted in as a member of the Association with full privileges by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting at the annual meeting of the Association, at the recommendation of the Doctrine and Executive Committees and at least one messenger be present at the meeting.

SECTION 3. Any church may withdraw from the Association at its pleasure and should notify the Association of this action in writing. Such action will be recognized by the Association at the next annual meeting.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of each church to furnish the Associational Clerk, before each annual session, a Church Profile, the forms provided by the Associational Clerk, giving the information requested as is applicable to each church situation.

SECTION 5. The Association may withdraw from any church which has become unscriptural in its doctrine or practices by a two-thirds majority vote of the messengers present and voting at the annual meeting. Such vote is to be taken by written ballot.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Association shall hold its annual meeting on Tuesday and Thursday following the second Sunday in October. Special meetings of the Association may be called by the Executive Committee provided two weeks written notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 2. Each church shall be entitled to be represented at the annual meeting by the pastor and one additional messenger. Churches which give to the association more than .5% of their undesignated receipts shall be entitled to an additional 2 messengers for every .5% of giving up to a total of 10 messengers for churches which give 2% of their undesignated giving."

SECTION 3. Churches are requested to elect their messengers and alternatives in conference to attend the annual meeting.

SECTION 4. In case of internal dissension in a church and two parties coming to the Association, each claiming to represent the church, neither party shall be seated until the Doctrine Committee determines which party is in union with the Association. The decision is to be affirmed by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

ARTICLE VI. OFFICERS

SECTION 1. General officers of the Association shall be: Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Parliamentarian, Assistant Parliamentarian, Director of Missions, Trustees and team leaders. Team leaders shall be chosen by the Nominating Committee as needed to serve the purposes of the Association (eg. Sunday School leader, Youth/Children leader). Team leaders will work with the Moderator and/or the Director of Missions to form a team to carry out assigned duties.

Associational representatives will be elected as may be deemed appropriate and elected in the Association. Associational representatives shall be a conduit of information between outside agencies and the Association. They may also represent the Association as the outside agency's policies specify.

SECTION 2. With the exception of the Director of Missions and Trustees, the terms of office for all officers of the Association shall be for one year with the privilege of continuing re-election. The Moderator and Vice Moderator shall not be eligible for re-election but one year in succession. (1) The number of Trustees shall be three. (2) The term of service should be for three years, with the term of only one expiring each year. In the first election of Trustees, the term of service for one should be three years, another two years, and the other one year. (3) Upon the expiration of term of service, the Trustee may or may not be re-elected for another term of three years.

Each term of office shall begin with the close of the annual session. The Associational financial year will run from October 1 through September 30.

ARTICLE VII. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Moderator shall preside and maintain the order of all meetings of the Association and Executive Committee. He shall serve as ex officio member of all committees of the Association.

SECTION 2. The Vice Moderator shall assist the Moderator and preside in the absence of, or at the pleasure of the Moderator.

SECTION 3. The Clerk shall keep a complete and accurate record of all meetings; shall prepare a "Book of Reports" to be distributed to messengers at the beginning of the annual meeting; and prepare minutes of the annual meeting (Annual Minutes) to be distributed to each church.

The Clerk shall distribute to the clerk of each church in the Association a congregational church profile as soon as they are received from the State Convention. This form is to be returned to the Clerk of the Association as soon as possible or by the deadline set by the Clerk and Director of Missions. All program reports should be returned by the same date.

An Assistant Clerk shall work with the Clerk in preparing the "Book of Reports," the annual minutes and the registration of messengers at the annual meeting.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall oversee the receipts and disbursements, by order of the Executive Committee of the Association, of the money of the treasury and ensure that a complete report is presented at the Annual meeting and a current report at each Executive Committee meeting.

An Assistant Treasurer shall be elected to assist the Treasurer by request and to serve in the event the Treasurer resigns or is ill or unable to function.

SECTION 5. The Parliamentarian shall upon the request of the presiding officer of the body, advise and assist the Association with respect to all matters involving Parliamentary Procedure.

An Assistant Parliamentarian shall be elected. The Parliamentarian and Assistant should always communicate with each other to ensure that this office is filled at each Associational Annual or Executive Committee meeting.

SECTION 6. Trustees have no authority except by direction of the Association and are not personally bound by signatures but are to be the legal signees for the Association. Trustees represent the Association in legal matters. Trustees act on behalf of the Association in acquisition and disposal of Associational property.

They sign all deeds of conveyance, execute all notes, bonds or mortgages, intervene in all suits, by authority of the Association.

All persons dealing with the Trustees, as Associational officers, may rely upon any written resolution duly adopted by the Association or Executive Committee, directing and authorizing the Trustees to act in its behalf and certified by the Association Moderator and Clerk.

ARTICLE VIII. RULES OF ORDER

The business meetings of the Association shall be conducted according to Robert's Parliamentary Practice or in a manner not contrary thereto.

ARTICLE IX. QUORUM

The quorum for the Annual Associational meeting or any special called meeting of the Association shall not be less than 25 percent of the member churches.

ARTICLE X. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the General Officers and Team Leaders elected by the Association and the Pastor and one member from each church in the Association. No Pastor, by virtue of his being an Associational Officer or Program Leader shall be disqualified as a member of the Executive Committee, from representing the church or churches he may be serving in the Association. Twelve of these members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to act for the Association on matters arising when the Association is not in session and to make a report of all work to the next session of the Association. This body shall meet at a time and place designated by the Moderator on Monday following the second Sunday of each quarter except for the October quarter which shall be replaced by the Annual Meeting. Special meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by the Moderator with a one week notice to the churches.

SECTION 3. All vacancies occurring on committees or among elected officers shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XI. ASSOCIATIONAL STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have such standing committees as may be deemed necessary to promote efficiently the work of the Master in our midst. The terms of office for all committee members shall be for three years except where specifically stated otherwise.

SECTION 3. THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE shall be composed of seven members It shall be the duty of this committee to nominate the Officers, Committees members, Team Leaders (as needed) and Institutional Agency Representatives. These nominees shall be notified prior to presenting of their names at annual session.

SECTION 4. THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE shall be composed of six members including the Treasurer of the Association. This committee shall: (a) present a Budget to the Association for the following year; (b) devise plans for raising the funds for the Associational Budget; (c) audit the finances and financial records of the Association annually and anytime there is a change of Treasurer or at the direction of the Association or the Executive Committee; (d) report all audits to the Annual Association Meeting.

SECTION 5. THE BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE shall be comprised of three members. The committee shall be responsible for and in charge of the upkeep and repairs of the Associational building, grounds, and equipment. SECTION 6. THE PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

A. The Committee shall be composed of 7 members of which 3 are pastors.

B. They shall recommend policies and procedures for the selection, supervision and termination of Associational staff personnel. Those policies and procedures shall be approved by the Association.

C. Prepare and maintain an organizational manual relation to the Association's staff personnel.

D. Develop and recommend to the association policies and procedures for paid and volunteer staff personnel.

E. When a staff vacancy occurs, other than the DOM, they shall serve as the search committee. When a DOM

vacancy occurs, they shall nominate a search committee and present it to the Executive Committee.

F. The Personnel Committee shall handle grievances as outlined in the grievance policy.

SECTION 7 THE ANNUAL MEETING COMMITTEE shall be composed of seven members. The duties of this committee shall be to

- A. recommend the church(es) to host the annual meeting and the preacher(s) and alternate preacher(s) to deliver the annual sermon for the following year,
- B. present suitable resolutions at the annual Associational meeting,

- C. bring a report to the annual meeting of those listed by the member churches as deceased since the last annual meeting,
- D. keep the historical records of the Association up-to-date,
- E. plan the program for the Annual Meeting(s) and present it to the Executive Committee at its October meeting,
- F. shall be responsible for registering messengers at the Annual Meeting(s),

G. and shall perform all duties specified in Article XIII (amendments to by-laws).

SECTION 7 THE DOCTRINE COMMITTEE shall be composed of five pastors and two laymen.

A. It shall examine applications of churches seeking admission into the Association in keeping with Article IV and make recommendation to the Association. It shall counsel with churches that are out of harmony of fellowship with the Association.

B. It shall also advise churches about candidates for ordination with the following guidelines: it serves on an advisory capacity only, serves at the request of the church from which the member is seeking ordination, is to examine such candidates as to their call and fitness for the gospel ministry and make such recommendations to the church as they feel led. It should regularly inform the Executive Committee of its work.

ARTICLE XII. JOB DESCRIPTION, DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. Title and Functions.

A. Position Title. This position shall be known as the Director of Missions for the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association.

B. Basic Functions. The Director of Missions shall serve as a minister to the church leaders of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association, as mission strategist, as chief administrative officer, and as a general leader of the Association.

C. The Personnel Committee shall be responsible to maintain, update and revise a job description as required,

making recommendations to the Association for approval as they are needed.

ARTICLE XIII. AMENDMENTS

The constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by a two-thirds majority of the messengers present and voting, provided the amendment has been presented to the Annual Meeting Committee at least 10 days prior to the annual meeting and presented to the Association in printed form on the first day of the annual meeting to be voted on the second day.

ARTICLE XIV. NON-PROFIT STATUS

The Tuckaseigee Baptist Association, Inc. is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

No part of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association, Inc. shall inure to the benefit of its' members, directs, officers, or other persons except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the exempt purposes of the organization.

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the Tuckaseigee Baptist Association, Inc. will be turned over to one or more organizations with similar purposes which are exempt as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
