

PROCEEDINGS OF THE

UPPER COUNTRY LINE ASSOCIATION

Wednesday Morning, August 5th, at 10 o'clock

1. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder O. J. Denny from Rom. 5:19-20-21 and was followed by Elder L. H. Hardy.

2. After an intermission, the Association convened, and after praise and prayer by Elder P. D. Gold, proceeded to business. On motion Bro. E. R. Harris was chosen Moderator, and J. W. Gilliam, Jr., Clerk, and Bro. R. L. Snead assistant clerk.

3. Petitionary letters were called for, but none received.

6. The messengers of New Hope church, together with the Moderator and Clerk, were chosen the Committee on Arrangements, and Brethren T. A. Stanfield and Andy Paschall were appointed a committee on Finance.

7. Letters from the several churches composing the Upper Country Line Association were read, and their standing was recorded in the statistical table of this minute.

8. The circular letter written by brother R. S. Somers was called for, read, received, and ordered printed in our minutes.

9. On methon the Association adjourned to meet Friday morning, August 17, 1917, at 9 o'clock

16. It was agreed that a section Meeting be held with the church at Prospect Hill, beginning on Saturday before 4th Sunday in May, and continue two dyas .Elders J. A. Herndon, J. W.

Gilliam, Jr., and B. F. McKinney were chosen to attend.

17. The Finance Committee was called upon to report, whose report was as follows:

3. That we extend our thanks to the warehousemen for their kindnes in furnishing us with water during the Association, and especially for their untiring efforts in keeping same well supplied.

4. That we extend to the Sheriff and other County officers our thanks for their good efforts in maintaining order for us during the Association.

CIRCULAR LETTER

To the Churches and Brethren composing the Upper Country Line Association, in session with the Church at New Hope, Rockingham County, Greeting:

Our Moderator at our last Association appointed me to write the Circular Letter. It is in much weakness that I attempt to do so at this time, and I trust that the brethren will bear with me while I try to stir up their pure minds by putting them in remembrance of our certain duties.

In the general Epistle of Jude, 21st verse, "Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the Mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life." The phrase, "In the love of God," has two significations. First, his love to us as follows. We love Him because He first loved us, the love of God having shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost, which is given unto us. We are persuaded that nothing shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus the Lord. We know nothing of the Lord or His dealings with men until He made it manifest unto us-the kindness and love of God appeared, manifesting the love of God. Secondly, Our love to God. Love begets love. He that is begotten loveth him that begetteth. Those who are not born of God have not the love of God in their hearts. John says If you love God keep His commandments. Again, he that loveth God keepeth His commandments. This teaching does not imply that the person within himself is able to perform what is commanded without divine aid. The true principle is taught by the apostle Paul when he said, "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God that worketh in you both to will and to do of His own good pleasure," etc.

Brethren, we get from this lesson that God so loved us that He gave His own Son for us, putting away sin by the sacrifice of himself, and hath forever perfected them that are sanctified by His spirit. In regeneration we are led to know him whom to know is life eternal. He manifests himself in love and mercy, which leadeth us to repentance. Then it is through the operation of His spirit that we have been thus changed, or translated from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of His dear Son. What mercy and love! He takes from us the heart of stone and gives us a heart of flesh which which is susceptible of instruction. Brethren, should we not abide in good works, having been killed to the love and practice of sin by the operation of His spirit in our souls. We are commanded to let our lights so shine that they may see our good works and gloryfy our Father (who hath done so much for us) who is in heaven. Let us all remember that scripture, "If any man love the world, the love of God is not in him." Then, love not the world nor the things of the world. May the Lord bless us with such spiritual blessings as we stand in need of from day unto day. Amen.
