The semi-annual meeting of the Southeastern Trustees was held on campus March 12-13. Among their actions were the TRUSTEES following: MEETING

- Revised the seminary By-laws to make the Audit/Investment Committee an elected standing committee rather than an appointed committee.
- Approved a 1984-85 budget, beginning August 1, 1984, of \$5,418,624.58.
- Granted tenure to Dr. Tom Graves, Associate Professor of Philosophy of Religion.
- Approved sabbatical leaves for: Dr. Tom Bland, Dr. James Good, Dr. Tom Halbrooks, Dr. Delos Miles (one semester), Dr. Ben Philbeck, Dr. Luke Smith, and Dr. Claude Stewart.
- Granted emeriti status upon their retirement later this year to Dr. Elmo Scoggin and Dr. James Blackmore.
- Established eight endowment funds, including two for academic awards in Christian Ethics and Christian Social Concern.
- Accepted a challenge grant of \$510,000 from the Charles A. Cannon Charitable Trusts for the Ledford Student Center and voted to name the gymnasium in the Center for Mr. Charles A. Cannon.
- Agreed to work with a forestry consultant to improve the quality and productivity of the seminary woodlands.

A faculty vacancy in Church History has been declared. This will CHURCH HISTORY be an additional teacher (third one) in this discipline. Dean Ashcraft will receive any VACANCY suggestions for the post and furnish a task description upon request. Recommendations should be submitted to the Dean's Office just as soon as possible.

During the spring semester, \$55,200 in student aid has been distributed to 154 students. Total aid so far this year, from all sources, amounts to almost \$500,000. Of this, \$244,569.50 has come from the Keesee FINANCIAL AID Foundation.

Dr. Tom Halbrooks, Associate Professor of Church History, has been ATS GRANT awarded an ATS competitive grant of \$8,000 in support of his 1984-85 sabbatical leave plan.

This generous grant will benefit this young scholar immensely as he pursues his very first sabbatical.
