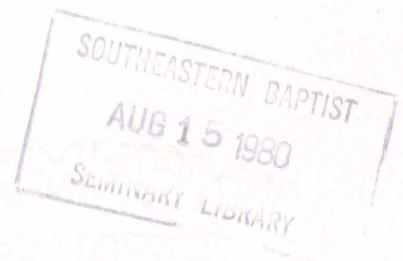
BUSINESS MANAGER
