Convocation was held August 28. Four of the five chairmen of trustees over the past decade were present to celebrate the 10th anniversary of President W. Randall Lolley.

Dr. Tom Graves, Associate Professor of Philosophy of Religion, <u>DR. TOM GRAVES</u> was honored during the Fall Convocation. He was presented the first annual Development Council Citation for Faculty Excellence. Along with the Citation, he received a \$2,000 check from an endowment established for this award by the seminary Development Council.

The Wiecua Road Baptist Church, Atlanta, Georgia, honored their WIECUA ROAD pastor, Southeastern alumnus William L. Self, on his twentieth anniversary by establishing a BAPTIST CHURCH \$10,000 scholarship in his name at the seminary. SCHOLARSHIP President Lolley was a guest of the congregation, August 26, to receive the check.

Bishop Stephen Neill died July 20 at age 83. He was a prolific writer on theology and church history, as well as Bishop of Tinnevelly, India. Bishop Neill had accepted the invitation to be Visiting Scholar in Residence at Southeastern Seminary for the BISHOP STEPHEN NEILL Fall term. He was one of the greatest Christian missiologists who ever lived.

Dr. Tom McKibbens, Associate Professor of Preaching, was welcomed to his labors at the Fall Convocation. Dr. McKibbens, TOM TOMalong with his family, have been in New England
during the past year where he has completed a
major book on the roots of Baptist preaching. It is scheduled for publication later this year.
