SUPERVISED INTERNSHIPS: We are pleased to announce that for the second year two internships in Richmond, Virginia, are open to students from Southeastern Seminary. Both have been approved by the Faculty for M 292 "Supervised Internship," and will begin in September 1976.

 Legislative Liaison Intern: Department of Social Ministries, Virginia Baptist General Board. R. Clint Hopkins, Field Supervisor. The intern will give attention to issues before the General Assembly, assisting the Department of Social Ministries with communication between members of the Assembly and constituients who are members of Virginia Baptist churches.

Open to Baptists, with some preference given to residents of Virginia. (Tim Brendle--a North Carolinian--is serving as an Intern this year.) A student who will return to the seminary to complete work toward his or her degree is also preferred. The intern will need to reside in Richmond, September through

The intern will need to reside in Richmond, September through May. Stipend: \$200 per month, with some additional scholarship assistance available. Fall and Spring. 8 hours per semester.

The intern will serve as chaplain to a juvenile correctional institution in or near Richmond, Virginia. 20 hours per week are required, which may be on weekends. Male and female chaplains are needed, Baptist and non-Baptist. Russ Ford--a native of Richmond--serves as Chaplain Intern at Hanover Learning Center this year.
