BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

ARTHUR BRISTOW RUTLEDGE

Arthur Bristow Rutledge, as executive director-treasurer of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board, provides executive leadership for all the Board's programs and finances.

The Home Mission Board is organized into fourteen programs of work: Evangelism Development, Mass Evangelism, Personal Evangelism, Chaplaincy Ministries, Church Loans, Church Extension, Associational Administration Service, Pioneer Missions, Rural-Urban Missions, Metropolitan Missions, Language Missions, Cooperative Ministries with National Baptists, Christian Social Ministries and Interfaith Witness.

There are approximately 2,000 missionaries serving in the fifty states and Puerto Rico, under the auspices of the Home Mission Board. The missionary force is directed and asissted by an Atlanta staff of 95 and a clerical force of about 120. Approximately 900 Southern Baptist chaplains relate to the Convention through the Home Mission Board.

A native of Texas, Dr. Rutledge is the fourteenth executive officer in the Board's 129 years of service. He not only represents the Home Mission Board in general, but also coordinates the work of its several sections and divisions.

Before taking over the executive leadership of the Home Mission Board at the beginning of 1965, Rutledge had served for six years as director of the Division of Missions. He came to the Home Mission Board from Texas, where he served for two years as secretary of Stewardship and Director of Missions for Texas Baptists. His previous service included twenty-five years as pastor, principally of churches in Texas.

Rutledge is a graduate of Baylor University in Waco, Texas; Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth. He received honorary doctor's degrees from East Texas Baptist College and Baylor University, and Distinguished Alumnus Awards from both Southwestern and Southern Seminaries.

Broadman Press published his books, <u>HOMES THAT LAST</u>, in 1954 and <u>MISSION TO AMERICA</u> in 1969. He is author of the 1976 home missions study book, <u>TOMORROW STARTS TODAY</u>. He continues to write articles for Baptist publications, including a regular column for HOME MISSIONS Magazine.
