FILM FESTIVAL Information on Films

- 1. CIPHER IN THE SNOW (youth ages12-17, adult) A gripping tale of a young boy's untimely death, simply because everyone has neglected him. A film to help young people realize all the opportunities they have of being a friend, confidant, or Christian witness to someone who needs them. (Broadman) Color: 24 min.
- 2. THE CREATION (children ages 4-9)
 This episode begins with JOT "playing" at the piano. He decides to render his own musical interpretation of the story of the creation. When he gets to the day God made man he grasps for the first time the great truth that God indeed created him. (Radio and Television Commission) Color: 4½ min.
- 3. GOD HAS A PLAN (younger children 6-8, older children 9-11) A lively film full of songs and conversations to show children that God's ministry is not confined to those involved directly in church vocations. God can use any situation and anybody to carry out His ministry. (Broadman) Color:12 min.
- 4. THE GREAT BANANA PIE CAPER (older children age 9-adult) A hilarious adventure film with a vital message. Young viewers will identify with Theodore and Mason, an unlikely pair of heroes, as they get into a zany banana pie bake-off and then attempt to deliver 75 banana cream pies on bicycles. Along the way they encounter, and learn to cope with, bullies, prejudice, and responsibility. Amid the hilarity viewers learn about the reality of friendship and of God's special caring. (Quadrus) Color: 28 min.
- 5. NOAH AND THE FLOOD (children ages 4-9) A rainy day reminds JOT and Tat of the story of the flood. They improvise their own version of the story. As they come to the end, they see a rainbow through the window. (Radio and Television Commission) Color:4½ min.
- 6. THE ODDBALL (youth ages 12-17)
 This film is about a Christian young person named Ralph Owens.
 He is on trial for being a misfit in his peer group. He has a girl friend, Mary. She's an oddball, too. These two young people provide their own defense. Outside the courtroom setting, the Oddball and his girlfriend introduce us to four sets of young people. They consider these groups to be the real oddballs, those who all around are conforming to each other. The Oddball defines these groups.
