
## I. <u>Introduction</u>:

The Committee met on March 22nd, 1980 and will next meet on April 26, 1980. In all cases, the bills discussed were ranked as Priority (formerly, aka "Class") II bills. There are several bills I believe that they all can be characterized as criminal law related bills with a civil rights or constitutional impact - which have also been reviewed by another bar entity (e.g.: Commission on Corrections or Criminal Law Section). In these instances of dual review, the positions taken are consistent with those of the other entity.

The Committee, in all cases, has done one of the following: 1) voted a specific position, (OR) 2) authorized the sending of an inquiry letter, on behalf of the Committee, stating preliminary viewpoints and questions, 3) referred the bill for further study to a Committee member, for report and action at the Committee's April 26th meeting.

A summary of the Committee's actions is listed below, as well as the items carried over - the Committee's Priority II bill letters are enclosed for your review and dissemination. Where there is past State Bar or Committee action/history, that is noted in the action summary.

The one major area in which the Committee has taken no action or vote to date is the series of mental health/patients' rights bills (includes several newly introduced



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items and AB 2044 (Perino) and AB 2144 (Bates). This is because the Committee's expert in this area has missed both meetings this year. These bills will either be reported on at the next meeting - or assigned out to another Committee member in time for action on April 26th.



The Human Rights Committee adopted the analysis and recommendation contained in that report. I have also reviewed the March amendments to the bill and have concluded that those amendments do not meet the objections of the Human Rights Committee/Criminal Law Section.

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

<sup>3)</sup> Note also AB **2956.** This bill arrived in bar's San Francisco Offices after the Committee's 3/22/80 meeting. It accomplishes the same end as SB 1814. Therefore, consider forwarding the enclosed letter regarding AB **2956.** The Conference and the Board of Governors have, in the past, been presented with abortion-related questions. Most frequently, the question of whether prior U.S. Supreme Court rulings (e.g.: Roe v. Wade) also require use of government funds to pay for abortions for indigent and low-income women.

<sup>4)</sup> SB 2024 is successor bill to 1979 SB 440 (Roberti). SB 440 was supported by the Committee last year. The Committee, in 1979, sought State Bar support of SB 440. The Board Committee on Legislation, on a split vote, adopted a "no position" position, which was also the action of the full Board of Governors.



Federal Indian Legislation: Congressman Edwards (of California) currently has pending legislation which would extend for several years the statute of limitations for trespass to American Indian property. U.S. government lawyers, rather than


impact, level of enforcement of this statute. The Committee's categorization of AB 2244 as a "Priority II" bill may or may not be appropriate, as this is a civil rights bill which expands the basis of liability for attorneys regarding acts of discrimination and therefore potentially affects all lawyers.



the Indian tribes, are charged with responsibility for bringing the lawsuits. There has been some history of neglect, delay, and the statute has to be extended so that the violations of rights can be redressed. The bill would also address methods for clearing the backlog of existing cases. The Committee voted, subject to the Chair's obtaining clearance from a majority of the Committee's Board Liaison, for the Chair to be authorized to send a telegram to the author expressing the Committee's support for the bill.
