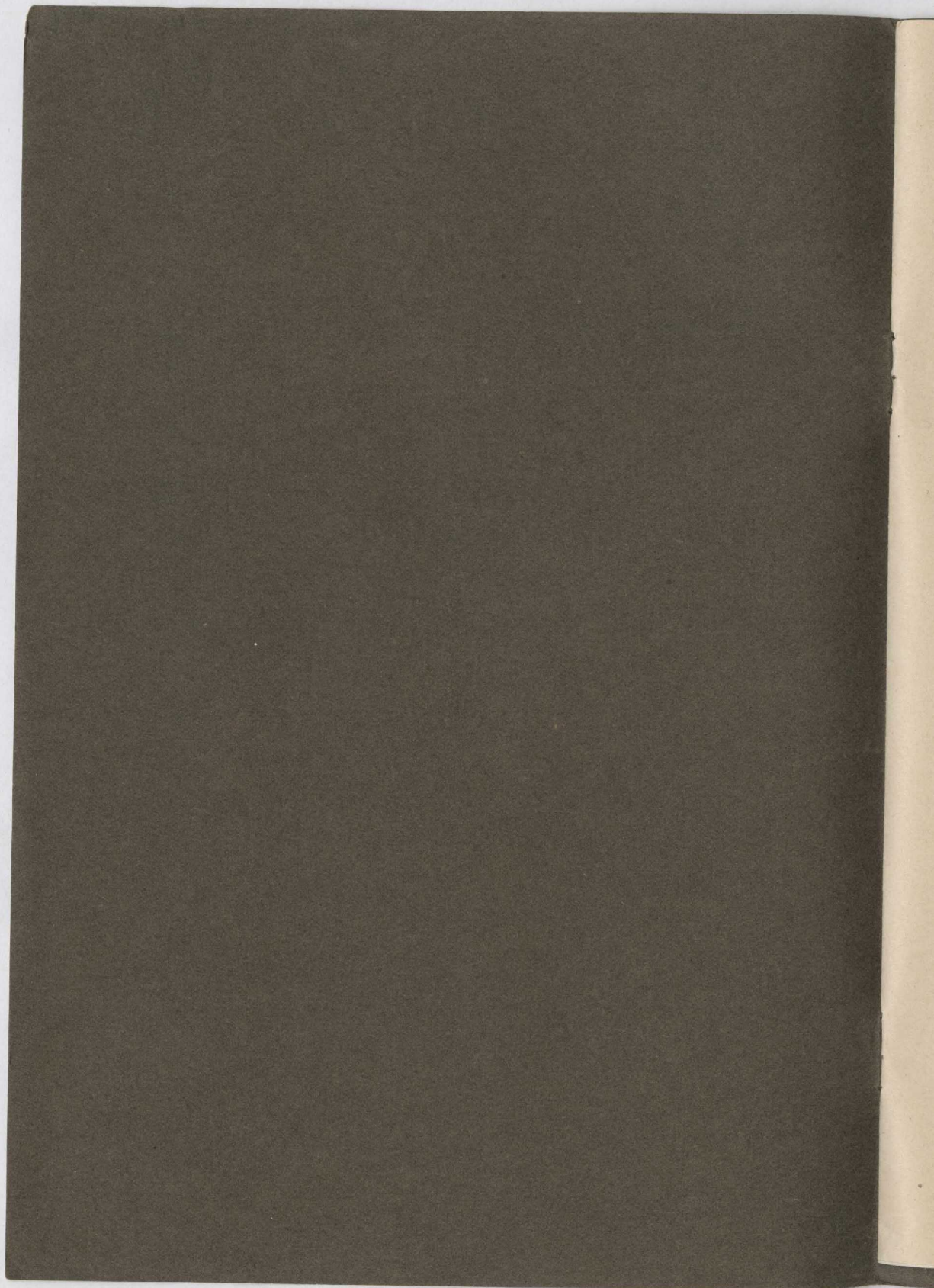

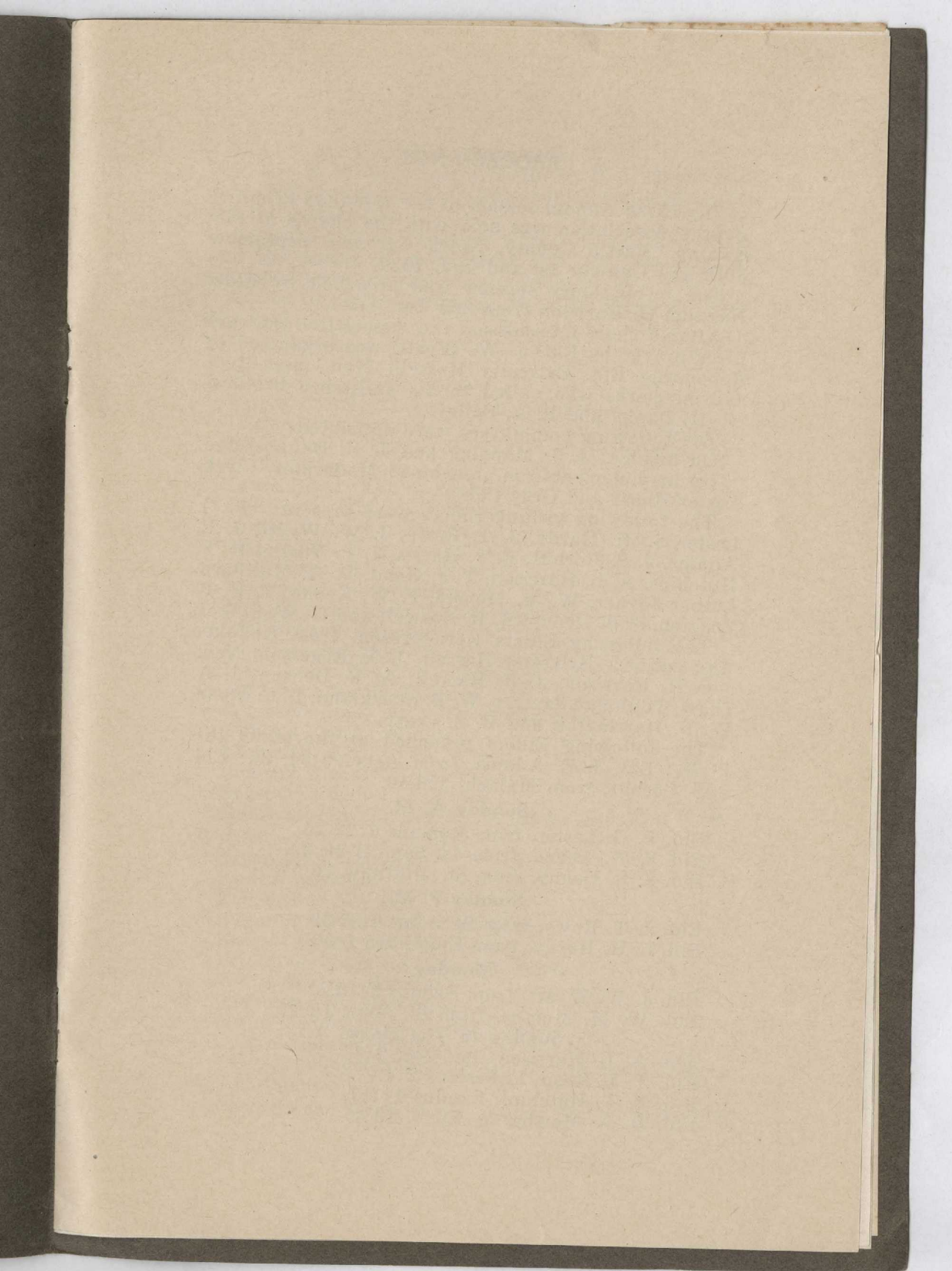

## PROCEEDINGS

The 157th Annual session of the Kehukee Primitive Baptist Association was held with the church at Flat Swamp, Martin County, North Carolina, September 30th and October 1st and 2nd, 1922.

Eld. Newsom H. Harrison was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, and Eld. W. B. Strickland to be his alternate, worship to begin at 11 o'clock.

Then adjourned to meet Monday, A. M. at 9 o'clock. Worship to begin tomorrow at 10 o'clock.

#### Monday A. M.

The Association pursuant to adjournment, met at 9 o'clock and was opened with praise and prayer by Eld. H. Hardy, and proceeded to business. The names of messengers were called over and those absent marked in the table of churches.

The corresponding letter was called for and read and ordered to be attached to these minutes.

It was agreed that if any member of this Association be present with any Association with which we correspond, that he is authorized to represent this Association.

Resolved: First: That this Association discountenances, condemns and forbids all kinds of trading and



misbehavior on or around the Association grounds while in session, and will endeavor to punish same to the full extent of the law, and that it recommends to the churches composing this Association that they have their places of worship incorporated to protect them from lawlessness.

It is agreed that this Association return thanks to God for the excellent weather and all other blessings and to the brethren and friends of the entire community for their liberal hospitality in the entertainment of this Association.

It is agreed that our clerk have 2,000 copies of these minutes printed and sent to him for distribution among the churches of this Association and the Associations with which we correspond; that he record a copy on our records, and be paid \$25.00 for his services.

Learning through the clerk of the Little River Association and members of our own body who were present, that W. A. Simpkins, of Raleigh, N. C., and his followers have been excluded from the church at Raleigh, N. C., and whereas, the churches comprising the Little River Association, of which she is a member, have endorsed and approved the action taken by Raleigh church in excluding them, W. A. Simpkins and his followers from the fellowship of the church, therefore, we the members and messengers of the Kehukee Association now in session do advise the churches composing our body to respect the action taken by the churches composing the Little River Association, with which we correspond.

There being no other business before the Association, it was adjourned to the time and place appointed with singing and benediction by the Moderator.
