

MINUTES

BETHLEHEM CHURCH MACON, GA.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 18th, 1923

1st. Singing by the Congregation and prayer by Elder J. A. Monsees.

The Introductory Sermon was delivered by Elder B. F. House, of Opelika, Ala. Text: 1st Tim., 1st chapter, 15th verse.

2nd. Moderator called for letters from the churches of the Association, which were read by Elders J. A. Monsees, C. W. Miller and A. A. Garrett and the names of the Messengers were enrolled.

3rd. The Association was perfected by the election of Elder D. Y. Hicks, Moderator, and J. S. McGee, Clerk.

4th. The usual committees were appointed as follows: On Preaching: Brethren John Tabor, F. W. Williams, A. S. Kersey, T. M. Nash and J. W. McGee.

To write Corresponding Letter: Elder J. A. Monsees.

On Finance and Distribution of Corresponding Minutes: Brethren T. A. Kendrick, R. E. Right and D. C. Wallace.

On Deceased Ministers and Deacons: W. R. Jones, D. F. Wells and Elder W. J. Heard.

12th. The minutes were read, approved and and adopted, this September 20th, 1923.

13th. The Association by a rising vote gave thanks to brethren, sisters and friends of Bethlehem Church for the loyal and hospitable entertainment of the body, also thanks to the City of Macon for the use of the building.

DECORUM

The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in our union and duly sent to represent them in the Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, producing letters from their churches certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats.

- 2. In the letters from the churches shall be expressed their members in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, on confession of faith, dismissed, excommunicated and died since last Association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall be denominated the ECHECONNEE ASSOCIATION, providing for themselves a Moderator and a Clerk, who shall serve them during the session; using the pastor of the church where they assemble or choosing one from the body as they please.
- 4. As one of the cardinal tenets of faith of the Primitive Baptists in that the Old and New Testaments are our only rule of faith and practice, and as the Bible recognizes no other religious disciplinary power but the Church, where God, in His wisdom, mercy, and in honor of His Son, placed it.
- 5. If new churches desire to be admitted into the union, they may petition by letter and delegates, and if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the delegates the right hand of fellowship.
- 6. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk, and called over as often as the Association may require.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a true record of the proceedings of the Association.
- 8. The minutes of the Association shall be read and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association adjourns.
- 9. Amendments to this form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.
- 10. To correspond with sister Associations of the same faith and order.
- 11. The Association shall have power to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the churches in the union.
- 12. It is also agreed that nothing shall be so construed in the above as to interfere with the fellowship and communion of the churches or brethren of this union, or with those with whom we may correspond, directly or indirectly; and nothing shall be presented to this body, as a query, or question bearing on the same, but shall be considered by the churches, as we believe is directed by the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1st. We believe in one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the God-head—the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost.

2nd. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the Word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice.

3rd. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular

election.

4th. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5th. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, by his own free will and ability.

6th. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of

God by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

7th. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.

8th. We believe that saints shall persevere in grace, and

never finally fall away.

We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances and washing of the saint's feet an example of Jesus Christ and that true believers are the proper subjects. We believe immersion the only mode of Baptism.

10th. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and a

general judgment.

11th. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be eternal, and the joys of the righteous will be everlasting.

12th. We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of the ordinances, only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of the hands of the presbytery,
