

Resolved, First: That this Association discountenances condemns and forbids all kinds of trading and misbehavior on or around the association grounds while in session, and will endeavor to punish same to the full extent of the law, and that it recommends to the churches composing this Association that they have their places of worship incorporated to protect them from lawlessness.

It is agreed that this Association return thanks to God for excellent weather and all other blessings, and to the brethren, sisters and friends of the entire community for their liberal hospitality in the entertainment of this Association.

Agreed that the clerk have 2000 copies of these minutes printed and sent to him for distribution among the churches of this Association and the Associations with which we correspond, that he record a copy on our records and that he be paid \$25 for his services.

There being no other business before the Associa-

tion it was adjourned to the time and place appointed with singing and benedictions by the moderator.
