To All Emeritus Missionaries

Dear Friends:

The Foreign Mission Board has entered into a new agreement with the Relief and Annuity Board concerning our Missionary Pension Plan. There have been a number of changes made in the administration of the plan, one of which is that beginning July 1, 1950 all pension payments to emeritus missionaries under our Missionary Pension Plan will be made direct to them from this office rather than through the Relief and Annuity Board. Many of the changes do not affect missionaries who are already receiving pension, but the new plan provides that every foreign missionary receiving a pension under the terms of the pension plan of the Foreign Mission Board, which this plan supersedes, shall automatically become a member of this plan as of its effective date. The amount of your pension has not been changed, and we shall continue to mail your check on the first of each month to pay your pension for that month.

In the future you will keep the treasurer's office-informed of any change of address, etc. that might affect the manner in which your pension checks are mailed. We deem it a privilege to enjoy this closer relationship with you, since your contacts will be made directly to this Board, whereas you might have approached the Relief and Annuity Board in the past.
