Club History 1956-57

During the past year we feel that we have indeed grown in word, in thought, and in deed. Our club members can be proud of the many accomplishments we have achieved. Our major projects for the year have been care of the Community House, which included the purchase of a punch bowl, six dozen cups, six dozen plates, and the purchase of brass plaques to be placed over the mantel in the Community House; sponsoring the Girl Scout and Brownie Scout Troops; and also sponsoring the Teen-Age Club. The club entertained all three of these sponsoring organizations with a special Christmas party, and also paid the expenses of a worthy Girl Scout at camp during the past summer. The club provided funds during the year for the purchase of street markers, and also decorated the Trophy Case for the local High School.

We have had many club activities during the year. Our club assisted three sub-standard families by providing them with food, clothing, bedding, and toys; sponsored the March of Dimes Drive and the Cripple Children's Drive; remembered 22 shut-ins at Christmas with boxes of mints; compiled a beautiful Scrapbook which received a red ribbon at the State Convention and we might add that our Year Book received a green ribbon; and \$25 was donated by our club to Dr. Charles Tabor when he and his family moved into our community. This money was to be used on some piece of medical equipment for his office.

Our activities were not limited to local projects

for we contributed to the Ten Penny Art Fund, purchased material and made aprons which were given as favors at the General Federation Convention in Asheville, contributed to Birthday Remembrance Program, and contributed \$5.00 to our District President to help defray her expenses.

Financial needs of the club were met by soliciting ads for the Year Book, sale of knives, serving dinner to National Guard Unit, and soliciting funds for street markers.

During the year we invited the following groups to attend our meetings: Franklinton Woman's Club, District Officers, high school faculty, and parents of the Celestial Choir.

Constitution And By-Laws

ARTICLE I—Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Youngsville Woman's Club.

ARTICLE II—Object

The object of this organization shall be to bring together those who are interested in the advancement of civic affairs of any nature with the purpose of promoting good citizenship.

ARTICLE III—Members

Section 1. Any person who is interested in the objectives of this organization shall be eligible to membership. The name of an applicant for membership may be presented to the organization by a member.

Section 2. Each member shall be expected to serve in at least one department.

Section 3. The dues of this organization shall be \$5.00, payable in advance on or before the October meeting. The club Treasurer shall remit \$1.50 per member to the State Federation and 10¢ per member to the Ten-Penny Art Fund.

Section 4. Any member shall be automatically dropped from this organization if dues are unpaid at the end of five months.

Section 5. Any member coming in later than ten minutes after the hour of meeting shall be fined 10¢.

ARTICLE IV—Officers

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-Presi-

dent, Third Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer. The First, Second and Third Vice-Presidents will automatically be elevated and the Third Vice-President and remaining officers will be elected at the January meeting. Installation of Officers will be held at the June meeting. All officers shall hold office for one year.

Section 2. The Executive Board will be made of the immediate past President, Officers, and Chairmen of Standing Committees. It shall have the power to transact business, which requires attention, between regular meetings of the club.

Section 3. Duties of Officers: a. President—The President shall preside at all standing committee meetings, restrict debate within the rules of order, appoint all standing committees, and call special meetings when necessary. She shall be entitled to vote when the vote is by ballot and in all cases when her vote would change the results. She shall be Ex-Officio Chairman of the Executive Board. She must present her yearly report at the annual business meeting in May. Before the annual convention for the N. C. Federation of Women's Clubs, the President shall answer Questionnaire which is sent annually to the club by the Chairman of the District of the State Federation. This questionnaire shall be included in the President's report to the club. At the March meeting delegates and alternates to the N. C. Federation of Women's Clubs shall be appointed. All delegates shall be instructed. The President shall also appoint a nominating committee of three active members at the December meeting and receive their report at the

January meeting. It shall also be the duty of the President to appoint one member to audit the treasurer's record by the June meeting.

b. Vice-President—The Vice President shall perform all duties of the President in her absence: In the absence of both President and First Vice-President, the Second Vice-President, and/or Third Vice-President will preside.

c. Recording Secretary—The Recording Secretary shall keep the roll, minutes and all other records of the club. She shall notify each member of all called meetings as directed by the President, stating the purpose for which the meeting is called.

d. Corresponding Secretary—The Corresponding Secretary conducts all correspondence of the club, and shall report briefly at each meeting any News from "The Club Woman" of club activities. She shall send notes of congratulations, sympathy, convalescence, etc., to club members when the occasion arises.

e. Treasurer—The Treasurer shall collect dues, account for and disburse the funds of the club under the direction of the President. She shall serve notice on all delinquents at the proper time and shall make a statement of accounts at each regular meeting and at the annual business meeting shall render a written report.

ARTICLE V—Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings shall be held on the Third Tuesday evening of each month at 8 clock.

Section 2. The organization shall have ten meetings beginning in September; ending in June. The December meeting shall be a special Christmas program (or Party)

and the June meeting in the form of a social and installation of officers.

Section 3. The regular meeting in May shall be the annual meeting and shall be for the purpose of reporting any other business that may arise.

Section 4. A quorum shall consist of one-third active members of the organization.

ARTICLE VI—Miscellaneous

Section 1. There shall be the following standing committees: Finance, Membership, Press and Publicity, Program, Project, Resolutions and Revisions, Scrap Book, Year Book, Birthday Remembrance, Help a Home and Community House.

Section 2. The expense of the President for attending the convention of the North Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs shall be paid by the club.

ARTICLE VII—Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall govern this organization in all cases to which they are applicable and which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws.

ARTICLE VIII—Amendments to the By-Laws

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds vote, provided notice was given at the previous meeting.
